
This book tells you about the legendary<sup>1</sup> lost land of Atlantis, from the only account<sup>2</sup> that exists of the city, written by Plato<sup>3</sup> in the 4th century BC, to later theories<sup>4</sup> about its supposed location and the geographical, archaeological<sup>5</sup> and historical theories about its existence<sup>6</sup> and destruction<sup>7</sup>.

### **What was Atlantis?**

According to legend, Atlantis was an ancient island civilization<sup>8</sup> in the Atlantic Ocean which flourished<sup>9</sup> about 12,000 years ago. Then, in the space of a night and a day, it sank without trace<sup>10</sup> beneath the waves. It was a powerful<sup>11</sup> kingdom<sup>12</sup>, whose army had conquered<sup>13</sup> large parts of Africa and Europe, before being defeated<sup>14</sup> by the Ancient Greeks. Its people enjoyed a privileged<sup>15</sup> lifestyle, surrounded<sup>16</sup> by fine things and beautiful palaces. Until one fateful<sup>17</sup> day, that is, when their golden world came crashing<sup>18</sup> down around them.

Many books and films have been based on the story of Atlantis, including this one, entitled *The Lost Kingdom*. This is a scene inside the fabulous palace of the Atlantean king.

But did Atlantis ever actually exist?

We have no eyewitness¹ reports to go by.

No ruins² have ever been found. Apart from one ancient account, later theories have often been based more in science fiction³ than in science fact. And if Atlantis did exist, two burning⁴ questions still remain—where was it located and how was it finally destroyed? Was it a natural disaster⁵ or an act of the gods? Is there anything science can do to solve one of the greatest mysteries of all?



## Beginnings of a mystery 玄奥由来

The first and only sources1 we have for the mystery of Atlantis are two ancient accounts, written by the Greek philosopher<sup>2</sup> Plato in the 4th century BC. They are written as imaginary conversations which take place between the philosopher Socrates<sup>3</sup> and three friends. The two accounts are called Timaeus and Critias. after their main characters4. Plato began to work on a third account but it was never completed.



Plato, the Greek philosopher, who lived from 427 BC–347 BC. The legend of Atlantis began with his ancient accounts. But were they historical fact or merely<sup>13</sup> hearsay<sup>14</sup>? No one knows.

### **Two accounts**

In his version<sup>5</sup> of events, Plato puts the story of Atlantis into the mouth of the poet and historian Critias. He says that he heard the story as a child from his grandfather, who had heard it from his own father. He, in turn, had heard it from his friend Solon<sup>6</sup> (c.640 BC–c.558 BC), a famous Greek politician<sup>7</sup> from Athens<sup>8</sup> who had been told the story by an elderly Egyptian<sup>9</sup> priest<sup>10</sup>. By the priest's time, the story was already very old, recorded in the ancient temple<sup>11</sup> records. It tells how, about 9,000 years before Solon's birth, or about 12,000 years ago, Atlantis was a rich, powerful island in the Atlantic Ocean whose armies conquered many of the lands around the Mediterranean<sup>12</sup> until they were finally defeated by the Athenians. This is Plato's account of the Egyptian priest's words:

'There was an island situated<sup>1</sup> in front of the straits which you call the Pillars of Hercules<sup>2</sup> (now called the Straits of Gibraltar<sup>3</sup>) and which was larger than Libya<sup>4</sup> and Asia Minor<sup>5</sup> (modern Turkey<sup>6</sup>) put together...Now on this island of Atlantis there was a great and wonderful empire<sup>7</sup> which ruled over the whole island and several others, and over parts of the continent<sup>8</sup>, and controlled, within the straits, Libya as far as Egypt and Europe as far as Tyrrhenia (Italy). This vast power attempted<sup>9</sup> to subdue<sup>10</sup> both my


country (Egypt) and yours (Greece) and the whole region<sup>11</sup> within the strait. Then, Solon, your country defeated the invaders<sup>12</sup> and saved us all from slavery<sup>13</sup>. But afterwards, there occurred<sup>14</sup> violent<sup>15</sup> earthquakes<sup>16</sup> and floods, and in a single day and night, the island of Atlantis was swallowed up<sup>17</sup> by the sea and disappeared...'




# | Mat was Atlantis like? | 原貌如何?

In his second account, Critias, Plato described the history, geography and people of Atlantis in more detail. He tells how the kings of Atlantis were created by Poseidon<sup>1</sup>, the Ancient Greek god of earthquakes and the sea. They were great architects<sup>2</sup> and engineers, building temples, palaces and harbours<sup>3</sup>. Their capital city was circular<sup>4</sup> in shape and built on a hill, surrounded by alternate<sup>5</sup> rings of land and water which were joined by huge bridges and tunnels. A huge canal<sup>6</sup> connected the outermost<sup>7</sup> ring of water to the sea. Behind the city was a great, fertile<sup>8</sup> plain where farmers grew the city's food. The island was also rich in minerals<sup>9</sup>, timber<sup>10</sup> and exotic<sup>11</sup> animals, including elephants.

### A magnificent<sup>1</sup> palace

According to Plato, the priest told Solon how the King of Atlantis lived in a luxurious<sup>2</sup> palace on top of the hill. In the centre of the palace stood a temple to Poseidon. This is how Plato describes it:


'The outside of the temple was covered in silver, apart from the pinnacles<sup>3</sup>. The pinnacles were covered in gold. Inside, the roof was made of ivory<sup>4</sup>, decorated<sup>5</sup> with gold, silver and other precious metals<sup>6</sup>. All the other walls and pillars were lined with precious metals. In the temple they placed golden statues<sup>7</sup>—there was Poseidon himself standing in a chariot<sup>8</sup> pulled by six winged horses, and of such a size that he touched the roof of the temple with his head...'



It seemed the Atlanteans had everything they could wish for. But, says Plato, they became greedy<sup>9</sup> and corrupt<sup>10</sup>. Zeus<sup>11</sup>, the king of the gods, decided to teach them a lesson and destroyed their golden land as punishment.

But even 50 years after his death, doubts began over whether Plato's Atlantis was a real place. Had the story truly been passed down to him as he claimed<sup>1</sup>, or had he invented it in order to discuss the politics of his own city, Athens? Was the account historical fact or hearsay? The debate<sup>2</sup> continues today.
