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INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

It was by mere chance that I came across a copy of diary written in English. The owner of it was a young girl who had just finished her study in senior middle school. Apparently, she was keen on literature and English, and was trying to practise composition in English. This copy covers roughly a period of a year before she was enrolled in a famous university, majoring in English language and literature.

The content of the diary shows that the girl has a wide scope of interests and the points she made in her discussion are pertinent. That is really not easy for her, because at that time she was only a third year student in senior middle school, and it was really marvellous of her to be able to write in English. Of course, some mistakes in grammar or inaccuracies in diction or somewhat Chinglish expressions are bound to occur. That is perfectly understandable. The most important point is that she made a persistent attempt to do the writing practice which is either totally missing or ruefully inadequate in most cases with students of English here in China.

Many students have difficulties in writing in English, because in most exercises nowadays they are only expected nition of the correct use of the language rather than creative production of opinion or description. Therefore their weaknesses seem to be very obvious. Actually they should be encouraged to write in English, which will in turn improve their reading or even speaking in English.

With the permission of the owner of the diary, I have selected 40 pieces from the original work and have revised or rewritten them, and translated them into Chinese. The manuscripts have been polished and approved by Ged Neary, professor of English, to whom I offer my gratitude and appreciation for many valuable comments on the early drafts. I alone am responsible for what errors in grammar or translation remain. And above all, my thanks to all those who made the appearance of this little book possible for their encouragement and generous help.

The readers do not have to take much notice of the events and characters, time and places which have no factual significance any more.

At the time our country is undergoing a rapid development in reform and opening up to the outside world, there is an ever growing urgent need of large numbers of people who are able to use foreign languages, especially English, as a tool of communication. It is my sincere hope that this little book may be of practical help to young learners of English who wish to improve their ability to read and write in English.
