使 用 说 明

为了适合分级教学的需要,本教材编写六册,每级一册,供大学公共英语一至六级泛听使用。每册包括十六课,每课安排会话、短文、练习及歌曲四项,供一节课使用。

第一部分,会话:包括基础会话(A-1)和情景会话(A-2)两部分。基础会话要求逐句听懂并进行复述,以提高口语能力。情景会话的语速和语调更接近自然,并配有背景噪音,要求听的时候一气呵成,以锻炼听懂真正英语会话的实际能力。整个会话部分的语速都稍高于教学大纲的要求,目的是使学生尽早接触节奏自然的、地道的英语,受到一定的"速听"训练。练"速听"的道理与练"速读"相同,经过一段时间的学习,将会收到明显的效果。

第二部分,短文:每课选入一篇文章,体裁多样、题材广泛,有较强的知识性和趣味性,课文难度低于泛读课文,高于精听课文,作为泛听课文,并不要求逐字听懂,目的是使学生通过大量获取信息来提高对语篇的整体理解能力。

第三部分,听力测验:采用多种测验形式(如选择、填空等),其中包括单项训练、单句训练和语篇训练。由浅入深,逐步达到全国统考水平,进而达到托福听力测验的水平。

第四部分,歌曲:每课选入一首歌曲,听歌的同时做填空练习。学唱英语歌不但能提高学习兴致,而且能加强对英语的感性认识,是对学习英语很有帮助的一个环节。从第一册的后半部起,全部选用著名的传统歌曲及流行歌曲。

每册分为 Workbook 及 Script and Key 两部分, Workbook 供预习及做听力练习使用, Script and Key 在录音结束后使用, 为了真正起到训练作用, 请不要在听录音前及听录音时阅读后半部的文字材料。

各课的词汇表要求学生预习。表中相当一部分词汇并不是生词,列表的目的是让学生在听录音前对关键词语略加熟悉,以减少听录音时可能出现的障碍(有些难度相同的单词,如果不属于关键词,则少收或不收入词汇表)。

本教材的录音大部分选自英、美等国近年来出版的英语有声资料,英音、美音并重,并有意识地选用了各种不同人物,不同声调、生动自然的录音,以使学生逐步具备广泛的话应能力。

本书在选材过程中,涉及面较广,选用了几十种引进教材及其他资料,出处不及一一注明。本套教材的六册课本,各册配磁带四盒,使用者可根据实际水平从任意一册开始选用。除适合高等院校教学或课外使用外.各册亦可作为独立的听力教材,供英语爱好者根据自己的水平选用。

公共英语听力课是几年前才开始在全国高等院校设置的课程。目前有不少院校在听力课之外,又增设了泛听课或组织课外听力活动。现已出版的听力教材和录音磁带,虽然种类繁多,也各有特色,但大多数引进教材,对我国大学公共英语教学和社会上广大英语爱好者来说,针对性不强,选用其中一种甚至几种,都不能达到理想的效果。

为了满足高校和社会上的实际需要,林还同志在总结自己教学经验的基础上,从大量资料中选出最受学生欢迎的内容,根据各级学生的水平,按照循序渐进的原则,编写了《英语听力训练》1—6册(附录音磁带),供高校泛听课和广大英语爱好者使用。

这套教材主要选自英美等国近年出版的有声资料,语言地道,符合现代规范。在内容的安排上,符合教学大纲的要求,有较强的系统性、科学性和实用性。在形式上,这套教材集会话、短文、测验、歌曲于一体,体裁多样,内容丰富。课文的选取注意了知识性和趣味性,有助于扩大学生的知识面和提高他们的学习兴趣。

欢迎广大教师和读者在使用《英语听力训练》后提出意见和建议,以便把这套教材修改得更完善。
