


A(3) O'Ryan: Mr. Li, I've got some good news for you. You've been accepted by Imperial College to do research for a doctorate. Li: That is wonderful!

Ph.D.: Doctor of Philosophy.




A(5) Li: When does the academic year start? The academic year begins in October and ends in June. The approximate dates are as follows:


Term 1: 7 Oct.—16 Dec., Term 2: 13 Jan.—24 Mar., Term 3: 28 Apr.—30 June.








B(2) Consul: Please take a seat. Make yourself comfortable. Now there are a few questions I would like to ask you if I may. Li: Of course. Go right ahead.



B(3) Consul: Would you mind telling me the purpose of your visit to the U.K.? Are you going to visit an exhibition?




B(4) Consul: What is the purpose of your visit to the U.K.? Are you going for trade purpose?




B(5) Consul: Could you tell me what are you planning to do in the U.K.? Are you going as a tourist?




B(6) Consul: Why do you want to go to the U.K.? Li: I want to study for a doctorate. The Imperial College has accepted me as a research graduate.
