
### Classics: The Red Shoes\*

## Making Decisions

In your family, who decides what you're having for dinner, where you're going on your next holiday, what to watch on TV?\* How long do you think people spend making decisions? You might be surprised to learn that the average person spends nearly three years of their lives making decisions.\*



A study has shown that **decision-making** takes up over seven hours a week for the **normal adult** in Britain. From deciding what to wear (four minutes) to what to eat (seven minutes) to whether or not to go out and meet friends (eight minutes), most people are wasting their lives worrying about unimportant things.\* About 60% of British adults say they often make the wrong decision, and over half of adults wish that somebody else would make all the decisions for them.



Readers of this book have a long time to wait until they reach the age where it is to make a decision—35 years old.\* But if you find it difficult to choose what to wear at the weekend, your parents probably find it even harder! Adults have to make serious decisions about when to take holidays, if they should spend or save money, what to buy their kids for their birthdays, and what schools to send their kids to.\*

The reason for this **indecisiveness** is too much choice.\* Think about **online** movie **sites**. There are thousands of films to choose from. When you go to a supermarket, look at all the choices of fruit, vegetables and meat there are. Do you buy the cheapest, the best-looking, or the biggest **item**? It's not so easy.
