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内 容 提 要

《大学英语听力理解与提高》是根据大学英语教学大纲对听力的要求并结合EPT和TOEFL听力测试的内容与形式编写而成的，是大学英语四、六级统考听力训练和EPT、TOEFL基础听力训练理想的强化教材，出版后一再重印。本书是配套教材，收有该书的全部听力材料和练习答案。

全书共36课，每课包括三部分，PART A为单句，PART B为对话，PART C为短文。每课各有50个习题，可自成一份试卷。习题采用统考中常见的多项答案选择法，以测试读者理解会意的能力。全书内容新颖，语言规范，选材广泛，实用性强，既可用于听力和口语训练，也可单独作为朗诵、阅读材料。

本书适用于高等院校大学生、研究生、出国留学人员和各类英语培训班学员以及具有一定英语水平的广大自学者。

《英语听力理解与提高指导》(A Guide to Improving Listening Comprehension)是《大学英语听力理解与提高》一书的教学参考书和练习答案。同时它又是一本独立的有声教材,配有录音磁带十盘。

本书除指导教学外,还可单独用作听力和口语的有声训练教材。

书中内容涉及日常生活、文化教育、政治经济和科学技术等方面的口语体裁语言材料。掌握书中内容,可顺利通过听力测试和进行口语交流。它是大学英语四、六级考试训练以及EPT和TOEFL基础听力训练的理想强化教材。

本书选材广泛、内容新颖、语言规范、实用性强,具有通用性和趣味性;文字由浅入深,录音语速由慢到快(从100 w/pm到170 w/pm)。全书共36课,每课分三部分:第一部分为单句训练,着重训练语音、语调,口头语言的结构和惯用法等;第二部分为各场合下的生动、有趣的对话;第三部分为各类短文。三部分形成一完整体系。该书在部分高等院校试用时,效果显著,深受师生和读者欢迎。

本书由杜曾荫、杨荣泉、赵森、贺永功编写。录音磁带由美籍专家Claudia Pope和Edward Pope录制。
