"The Park of the Three Biomes"

Practice F

The arctic air is cold. The water is freezing. Polar bears swim back and forth. Penguins sit together on the snow, waiting for dinner.

A few feet away the air is warm and moist. Tropical birds fly from tree to tree, screeching to each other.

Nearby is another very different habitat. Here the climate is temperate. Sea lions swim in the cool water. Japanese monkeys swing in the trees.


Are you in a magical land of the future? No, you are at the new Central Park Zoo in New York City.

This zoo is very different from most zoos. Its three communities, or *biomes*, are very carefully controlled. The environment is just like the animals' natural one. There are no cages or iron bars between the animals and the people. Snow monkeys, African lions, Asian bears, snakes from the Amazon, and birds from Brazil are separated from human visitors by natural boundaries. Water moats and ponds, rock hills, trees and small valleys keep the exotic animals in their own worlds.

The animals eat excellent food. It is more healthful than the food served in some restaurants! Every week, the zoo's 450 birds and animals eat 75 rodents, 1,250 pounds of fish, 500 pounds of worms, 1,000 flies, 8,000 crickets, and a ton of roots, seeds, and vegetables. Wouldn't you like to eat so well?


