

《职通英语(第二版)》系列教材在第一版的基础上,收集汇总了全国近百所用书院校师生的使用反馈,结合国内高等职业教育英语教学现状和我国社会经济发展对高职学生英语综合应用能力的要求修订而成。

■修订背景

近年来,职业教育发展迅猛,国家日益重视,政策性文件频出。《国家职业教育改革实施方案》《加快推进教育现代化实施方案(2018—2022年)》《中国教育现代化 2035》《中国英语能力等级量表》等先后颁布,教学要求和教学理念持续更新。同时,国家教育事业发展进入"十三五"规划时期,"互联网+"大背景对新形态教材助力信息化教学的需求日益迫切。

■ 修订原则

- 1. 传承经典。保留经典的文章、话题、趣味练习等,延续以言语功能为主线的原则设计教学内<mark>容,彰显语言的文</mark>化负载功能,增强文化自信,拓展学生的国际视野。
- 2. 日臻完善。通过增加热门话题、单元词汇表,调整语法项目和词语表达,内容上精益求精;同时,优化版式设计, 形式上注重减轻学习的倦怠感。
- 3. 删繁就简。精简部分阅读素材字数,将部分传统科普类文章替换为趣味性文章,与高职学生的认知基础和实际水平相匹配,贴近学生的现实生活。
- 4. 与时俱进。注重信息化技术与教材开发的深度融合,通过微课、点读、试题检测平台等资源和功能,支撑混合式教学模式,有利于自主、合作、探究学习的有效开展。
- 5. 思政育人。语言教育不仅要发挥其教育价值,还要对学生进行理想、信念的塑造。教材结合中国<mark>梦和改革开放</mark> 40 周年的成果,把立德树人的理念体现在英语教育的全过程中,将思政教育渗透到学生生活的方方面面。

■ 修订内容

- 1. 增加就业、出国留学、继续教育、培训、移民等话题,内容贴近学生的现实生活。
- 2. 阅读中用趣味性文章替换传统科普类文章, 寓教干乐。
- 3. 依据九级量表增配单元词汇表,并增加音标、音频以及相关短语。
- 4. 调整语法项目和词语表达,减少语法习题数量,为自主学习释放更多的空间。
- 5. 优化版式设计,调整字号及行距,有效减轻学习的倦怠感。
- 6. 删减部分阅读篇章,与高职学生认知基础和实际水平相匹配。
- 7. 录制微课, 支撑混合式教学模式。
- 8. 开发试题检测平台、单词移动学习软件等,配设点读功能,弥补传统教学方式的不足。

■ 使用建议

鉴于目前高职高专学生入校时英语水平差异较大,且不同专业对学生未来使用英语的需求有异,建议可分为一般要求和较高要求选用本教材。一般要求可选用《职通英语》1-3级,较高要求可选用《职通英语》2-4级。

■ 改编团队

《职通英语(第二版)》系列教材由中国功能语言学研究会名誉副会长、东北师范大学杨忠教授和《Network Now》作者之一、德国知名语言教育专家 Lynda Hübner 女士担任主审;中国职教学会通识文化课类教学研究中心副主任、韶关学院安晓灿教授,教育部职业院校外语类专业教学指导委员会委员、成都纺织高等专科学校王朝晖教授,四川省高校外语教学研究会副会长、成都理工大学段成教授担任总主编,负责全书的总体编排和书稿的审订;由来自全国近四十所职业院校的英语专业骨干教师、学科带头人,负责修订工作及立体资源建设,在此一并表示感谢!

虽然我们倾力编撰、精心制作,但书中难免会有不足之处,欢迎使用该教材的广大师生批评指正,以便我们的教材日臻完善。

■ 第一版前言

《职通英语》是在德国克莱特出版集团 (Klett Group) 出版的 Network Now 系列教材基础上,根据我国新时期高等职业教育改革需要改编而成的用于高职高专院校的公共英语教材。该套教材共分 4 个级别,每级由《综合教程》《教学参考书》《单元跟踪测试》及配套的音频和 PPT 课件组成。

■ 改编背景

世纪之交,我国高等教育首先实现了由精英教育向大众教育的历史性转变,随之国家适时调整高等教育结构,加快发展高等职业教育。2014年2月26日国务院常务会议部署加快发展职业教育,其举措之一是创新职业教育模式,建立学分积累和转换制度,打通中职、高职、本科、研究生的上升渠道。新的职业教育发展趋势要求高职高专英语教学进一步深化改革,编写适应新形势需要的高职高专英语教材势在必行。东北师范大学出版社根据教职成司函(2013)184号"关于'十二五'职业教育国家规划教材选题立项的函",申报立项改编 Network Now 获得批准,成立了由外语教育专家和高职高专英语教学名师组成的教材改编课题组。教材改编课题组通过会议研讨,形成了教材改编方案,并分组进行改编,共同把关,确保教材改编质量。

■ 改编原则

- 1. 思想性原则:教材内容有利于弘扬社会主义核心价值观,有利于学生形成正确的世界观、人生观、价值观,有利于学生拓展国际视野并了解英语国家文化的精华,有利于培养学生语言文化差异意识和鉴别能力。
- 2. 科学性原则:教材内容选择及编排应遵循语言使用规律及语言学习规律,整套书内容承接有序,语言地道准确,图文搭配合理,编排体例规范。教学内容的选择和设计与人才培养模式改革相互促进,适于自主、合作、探究的学习方式。
- 3. 目标性原则:依据《高职高专教育英语课程教学基本要求》确定整体教学目标,明确学生应达到的听、说、读、写水平。每项教学内容有明确的教学目的,通过课堂活动和练习实现教学目标,并通过任务检验学生掌握的程度。
- 4. 兼顾基本要求和拓展需要的原则:依据《高职高专教育英语课程教学基本要求》分级设计教材内容,既满足学生自主学习的需要,又有利于基础较好的学生尽快提高英语水平。

■ 改编内容

- 1. 将书名改为《职通英语》(Network Now)。
- 2. 将原书序号 A 1, A 2.1, A 2.2, B1.1 改为《职通英语》1, 2, 3, 4。
- 3. 改编部分单元结构设计。
- 4. 替换部分阅读短文。
- 5. 将 1-3 级学生用书中的德文导语改为英文导语。
- 6. 改编书中的部分语法项目及其讲解,以满足高职高专学生的英语学习需求。
- 7. 适当增加翻译练习,强化对重要语法项目和表达式的理解,同时培养学生对英汉语言差异的敏感性。
- 8. 重新编排词汇表,并对不同要求的词汇进行标注。
- 9. 为介绍英语国家文化的短文配上中文译文。
- 10. 保留学生用书中 Self-study, Test Yourself 和 Language and Culture 的参考答案以及听力原文,并将其余部分的参考答案、译文和听力原文纳入教师用书中。
- 11. 为《综合教程》1-4级配套增编《单元跟踪测试》1-4级,其中2-4级包含高等学校英语应用能力考试模拟试题和普通高校专升本全国版英语模拟试题。

■ 显著特点

- 1. 以言语功能为主线设计教学内容,突出相应的语法项目和词语表达。
- 2. 以情境为依据选择语言教学内容,场景贴近生活且语言地道。
- 3. 教学目标设计明确, 且练习丰富多样, 注重全面提升听、说、读、写、译五大语言技能。
- 4. 图文并茂, 且音频模仿真实场景录制, 使教材内容更加生动, 犹如身临其境。

■ 使用建议

鉴于目前高职高专院校学生入校时英语水平差异较大,且不同专业对学生未来使用英语的要求也有异,建议可分一般要求和较高要求来选用本套教材。一般要求可选用《职通英语》1-3级,较高要求可选用《职通英语》2-4级。







Do you want to go on holiday, but don't know what to do with your chickens? The Chicken Hotel was opened in 2010 to give your chickens a holiday, too!


Guest Rooms:

Our comfortable, four-star rooms are designed for four to six chickens. Sorry - single and double rooms aren't available! All our rooms have the usual facilities, with a balcony offering wonderful views of the beautiful Cornish countryside. The rooms are, of course, cleaned every day. And where is food served? For reasons of hygiene, meals aren't served in the rooms, but in the outside dining area on the balcony!

Prices:

A flat rate of 75p per chicken + £2.00 per room per night, full-board (all-you-can-eat buffet for breakfast, lunch and dinner - drinks included).

An example for five chickens for three nights: $(5 \text{ chickens} \times 75p = £3.75) + (3 \text{ nights} \times £2.00 = £6.00)$



=£9.75 in total.

Extra Services:

Shuttle Service

Your chickens are brought from your home to the hotel in our chauffeur-driven "chicken limousine". At the end of their stay, they're driven back home.

Butler Service

If you have a lot of chickens, our "chicken butler" can visit your home to give them food and water. The price is based on the distance to your home.
