前 言

当前社会上学习英语的人很多。已经掌握一定程度英语的人都希望对自己的英语水平作一番检验。研究生试题反映着对英语的一定要求,对于考生及社会上广大学习英语的人们均是一个衡量的尺度。另一方面,学习英语需要大量实践。做练习是一种很好的方式。这本试题集可供自学者练习、提高之用。而且试题与一般的习题集不同,它是高度综合性检验知识的手段,要求在错综复杂的条件下迅速作出判断。进行这种练习往往能巩固已有知识、加深理解,发现自学中所不易发现的问题。再者,无论是教科书或语法书,由于篇幅及本身的系统性所限,有些零星语言现象不易全部包括在内,这些现象都可能在试题中得到反映,从而弥补了系统学习中可能存在的“空白”。总之,我们希望这本试题解答不仅对考生有所帮助,而且对自学提高也会有所裨益。

本书收集了1980年全国研究生英语统一试题正、副题和26个重点院校以及上海市、福建省1979年理工科研究生试题。答案力求解决三个问题:1.如何答,2.为什么这样答,3.如要进一步了解有关问题,到哪里查阅。我们认为要牢固掌握知识不仅应该能够判断什么是对的,也要能够辨别什么是错的以及为什么是错的。所以我们的解答不仅给出正确答案,而且还指出易发生的错误,有的题目还对类似情况加以介绍,以便触类旁通。为了读者进一步学习,我们推荐张

道真所编“实用英语语法”为主要参考书，答案中指出参考节次，其它参考书另行注出。

为了提高读者的答题能力，编写了“答题要领”。其中指出了一些答题和准备中应注意的问题，希望能对读者思考问题有所启发。

本书在编写过程中，不少同志提供了宝贵意见，并请西安外语学院刘毓麟副教授对本书作了校订，在此一并衷心的感谢。编者水平有限，错误在所难免，希望读者批评指正。

一、试题部分完全保持原样，因此各大题标题写法不尽一致。有的题在一段文章内有若干要求，为便于与解答查对，加上了①②③等序号。

二、试题中有些涉及汉语人名、地名拼写规定，由于原题是在1979年出的，有的不合规定，编选时亦未加变动，但在解答时则采用了新的拼写法。

三、解答部分各大题采取了统一标题，如“选择填空”、“时态、语态”、“改病句”等。

四、为便于读者理解，对有些比较难的句子及短文加了译文。

五、本书所用符号如下：

1. 破折号（——）表示对该题的说明。
2. 引号（“ ”）表示句型或译文。
3. 斜线（／）表示可供选择的答案。
4. 黑体字表示改病句中之改动部分。
5. 括号上方加斜十字（（*））表示改病句中应去掉的词。
6. 方括号（[]）内为“实用英语语法”（1979年商务版）中参考的节次。
