

visited a fantastic glass platform called the Glacier Skywalk. The skywalk is in Canada. Tourists go there to see the amazing views. The skywalk sticks out over a scenic valley in Jasper National Park. The viewing platform is 280 metres high. That is about the same height as 28 double decker buses piled one on top of the other!
