为了配合高等学校英语听力课教学和大学英语四、六级全国统考复习工作,吉林工业大学外语部和哈尔滨船舶工程学院外语系结合本院校教学实践经验,并按照全国大学英语教学大纲的要求,合作编写了这本听力训练材料。

本书包括听力训练和听力试题两大部分。训练分为单句(statements)、会话(conversations)和短文(passages)三种形式,按数字、时间、地点、人物、新闻报道、天气预报等几十种难度不同的话题和内容分类编排,因此具有较强的适用性、知识性和趣味性。听力试题部分是按国家标准试题模式编写的,共有十套模拟试题,并附有四套最新托福听力试题。

本书还收入了全部听力训练题和听力试题的听力材料原文及答案。此外,两院校还备有由外籍专家录制的有声资料。对于准备参加大学英语四、六级考试,研究生英语过关考试,出国人员英语水平考试及托福考试等类人员均有帮助。
