

Foreword

The process of the European economic and political integration has been accelerating since the promulgation of the Single European Act in February 1986. As scheduled by the EC authorities, the Single European Market will be set up by the end of 1992. On July lst, 1990, the European economic and monetary union entered upon its first stage. This is an epoch-making event. The establishment of the European internal market will exert a great and far-reaching influence on European and world economy and politics. Therefore, the governments and the personalities of various circles of all countries in the world have been paying a great deal of attention to the very event, especially, the latter attracted deep interest from the experts and scholars all over the world.

This book contains the proceedings of the Third International Symposuim on the European Communities which was co-sponsored by the Chinese Society for EC Studies and the Department of World Economics, Wuhan University, and was held on October 16—18, 1990, at the University. The main theme of the conference is the international implications of the Single European Market. The sessions are organized around the following topics: 1.1992 and the EC: Economic and Political Effects; 2.1992 and the World: Implications in the Context of International Relations

and World Economy; 3. 1992 and China: Challenges, Opportunities and Responses. More than 50 of the scholars and experts both at home and abroad and the officials of the EC and its Delegation in Beijing attended the Symposium. The proceedings of the conference includes 35 papers submitted and they are arranged in the above order.

We are grateful to the EC Commission and the EC Delegation in Beijing for sending their officials Mr. Frank H. Hesske and Ms Regina Piovesana, representing respectively the Communities and The Delegation, to attend the conference, and for providing valuable materials and references for the Chinese contributors.

Special thanks are due to the State Education Commission and the Chinese Society for EC Studies. Their conceptualization of the conference and their generous financial support made both the Third China-EC International Symposuim and this book possible.

We wish to extend our gratitude to all those who participated the conference, especially, to all the contributors who submitted their valuable and stimulating theses. While the views of the theses are the authors', their editing and proofreading are solely our responsibility. If the readers and authors find any mistakes in the book, please let us know so that they can be corrected.

We are greatly indebted to many people who helped us to pull together the resources necessary for this conference. Chi Minyou, President of Wuhan University, was instrumental in the realization of the Symposuim. Vice-presidents Tao Delin and Chen Youbin provided important organizational resources and support. The heads and staff members of the University's Presidents' Office, Foreign Affairs Section, Scientific Research Section

前 言

自从1986年2月欧洲一本化法颁布以来,欧洲的经济与政治一体化一直在加速进行着。根据欧共体当局计划,将于1992年底建成欧洲统一大市场。1990年7月1日,欧洲经济与货币联盟进入了第一阶段。这是一个划时代的事件。欧洲内部市场的建立,不仅对欧洲,而且对世界的经济和政治都将产生重大而深远的影响。对此,世界各国的各界人士一直对这一事件十分关注。这一事件引起了全世界有关专家和学者的浓厚兴趣。

This Third International Conference of the Chinese Society of EC Studies will be, I am convinced, as exciting as the previous conferences with everybody happy to meet each one again, in good health and bringing in his / her bag new research and new questions.

Despite the fact that little time has elapsed we worked together in Chengdu on European integration issues, so many events happened in the meantime, —on which European scholars focus more and more their work and analyses:

the CEDECE,—last week held a prominent major Conference on the subject with 300 participants and about
50 scientific reports dealing with the political and economic problematic of EC—Eastern relations. Papers of
this Conference together with those of another impor-

EC held at the University of Gent last 10 and 11 May 1990 will be sent to your Society's secretary, at Fudan University for distribution to interested members. EC-SA—Europe, which is the umbrella association of the European Community members states national associations of EC Studies, is also launching research groups on Eastern Europe. Three working groups will deal respectively with the legal adaptations, the administrative adaptations and economic adaptations. A joint conference with Eastern Europe academics will present the first findings in Brussels next June.

The second area of interest today is the internal evolution of the Community. A qualitative step is on the way. The two Intergovernmental Conferences on the EMS and on the Political Union, which will open next December will give a fresh impulse to the integration process. Since we met in October 1988, the mechanisms of integration we spoke about are working fairly well: Common goals are expressed as well as a political will to adapt the institutional system.

As in the sixties, today, scholars are paying more and more attention to the process itself, particularly in the United States of America. It will be at the center of the American—ECSA (European Community Studies Association) yearly Conference at the end of October 1990.

ECSA — Europe will announce very soon its first ECSA — World Conference which is planned for the 21-23 of November 1991. It will take place in Brussels. Invitations will go to all exist-

ing EC Studies associations.

Topics will deal with the present state of development of the Community. At that time, results of the two intergovernmental Conferences will be in sight.

The second main topic will be the European Community as perceived by academics from the non members states, in particular the external role and the external perspectives of the EC.

Finally, a session will be devoted to the Trends and Fields of University research in EC Studies.

Your CSECS will be invited to participate in the Conference. It will no doubt be of interest to you to hear right now about these projects.

I am so sorry not to be with you and attend your Third International Conference. We are more than ever conscious of the importance of the academic work you are doing on the European Community and its developments.

Let me wish you lots of success and stimulating exchanges. I am sure, my collegue, Mr. HESSKE will find most interest in working with you and will become, as we are, your friend.
