### 前言

一、在长期的外语教学实践中,我们深刻地认识到,培养学生掌握和运用所学外语知识的能力是十分必要的,而培养学生的阅读能力,提高阅读速度尤为重要。

若想培养学生的外语阅读能力,提高阅读速度,除学习和掌握必要的外语知识外,还必须培养学生的学习兴趣,给学生一些由易到难、由浅入深、富有兴趣的阅读材料。通过大量的阅读实践,增强外语的语感,熟悉外语的语言结构,巩固和运用所学的外语知识,才能提高阅读速度,培养阅读理解能力和翻译表达能力,从而获得掌握和运用外语能力的技巧和熟巧。这是我们编写本书目的之所在。

二、本书取材于英国牛津大学出版的,由L.A.Hill 编写的 《Elementary Stories for Reproduction》、 《Intermediate Stories for Reproduction》和《Advanced Stories for Reproduction》(1至6册)。经过精选,共编三册。

三、本书文章短小精练,内容生动有趣, 语 法 简 单 明 了,语言通俗易懂,生词量小,复现率高,富有浓厚的生活 性、故事性和趣味性,便于理解、记忆和复述。这是本书的 主要特点。

四、为了便于读者阅读、检查阅读速度和阅读理解能力,每篇文章除附有译文外,还有插图,编有练习、练习答案、注释和单词表,每册书后还设立了检查阅读效果的图表。

在使用本书时,要求读者在尽可能短的时间内,读完一篇文章,然后认真记录阅读每篇文章的起止时间,计算每分钟所读单词数,把读每篇文章的速度和理解度记入书后的图表。如果理解度在70%以上,可加快阅读速度,如果理解度在70%以下,则应放慢阅读速度。

五、本书既可供初学英语者使用,也可供具有一定英语水平的英语爱好者使用,既可做课堂读、写、听、说、译的语言材料,也可用做课外通俗读物。

本书在编写过程中,经过美籍教师审阅,在此谨致谢意。 由于水平所限,加之时间仓促,疵漏、错误之处,望批评指正。
