本书由五部分组成,包括: 1. 听力理解(备有磁带), 2. 阅读理解, 3. 词汇与语法结构, 4. 完形填空, 5. 写作。各部分内容注意到系统性, 又具有一定的针对性和实用性。书中还对一些重点答案作了注释。学生可在教师指导下或独立地把本书作为平时复习或考前训练的参考书。

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前 言

《大学英语基础训练》是以国家教委颁发的《大学英语教学大纲》为依据,参考全国统一的《大学英语四级考试大纲》及《大学英语四级考试样题》,按照天津市试行的《大学英语三级考试大纲》的要求和规定并参照天津市《大学英语三级考试样题》的内容与形式编写的。编写目的主要是使学生在教师指导下或独立地通过对所学语言知识全面而系统的复习,进一步掌握要点,并通过丰富多样的语言基本训练,既巩固加强掌握语言的技能又提高语言熟巧的程度与应试的实际能力,以便顺利地通过测试并争取较好的成绩。

本书由五部分组成,即:1.听力理解(备有磁带),2.阅读理解,3.词汇与语法结构,4.完形填空,5.写作。各部分都在重视系统性的同时,强调针对性与实用性。为了使本书不仅能在教师指导下作为平时复习或考前训练的参考书,而且便于学生独立自学,书中在适当与可能的条件下,并提供了一些重点答案的解释及有关注解。总之,作为天津市大学英语三级考试复习亦有一定参考价值),本书是广大学习大学英语的学生复习与准备考试的实用辅助教材,也是大学英语教师教学与辅导的实用性较强的参考材料。
