

前 言

《大学英语四级听力测试》旨在强化学生的听力训练,增强学生的应试能力,提高学生的听力成绩,从而达到国家教委颁发的《大学英语教学大纲》所规定的听力目标。

本书按《大学英语考试大纲》的精神,仿照全国大学英语考试办公室公布的《大学英语四级考试样题》的听力模式,汲取国内外出版的听力测试集的精粹,揉进编者的统筹思路,汇成 20 套试题。每套试题分 Section A 和 Section B 两部分。Section A 有 10 题,每题含一组对话;Section B 也有 10 题,分别安排在三篇短文之后。每套试题自成体系,但在内容编排上做到前后照应,循序渐进,由浅人深

本书所选题材广泛,而且寓知识性、趣味性于一体,针对性强,实用性广,可听性浓,这无疑会激起读者的浓厚兴趣。

为方便测试,提高听力效果,全书的 20 套试题和 20 套听力原文,均以活页形式配套装袋。
