

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内容提要

《英语听力教程》是一套有指导的、循序渐进的听力课本。全书共分三册。供高等学校英语专科和本科一、二年级学生听力课使用,也可供高等院校其他各专业、教育学院、电视大学及自学者使用。本书已定为 1988 年 开播的卫星电视英语专业的听力课教材。

本书共分 24 个单元,每单元由两部分组成:

第一部分集中进行单项听力方法训练,内容包括: 抓主旨大意、推理、猜字、预测、记忆细节、听新闻广播等。

第二部分由听写和听力欣赏穿插组成。听力欣赏取材于世界各地名胜古迹、中外历史人物、西方风土人情等 题材;听写部分包括填空、去掉多余的字、段落听写等练习形式。

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前言

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Intermediate Listening 为第二册、适合于能听懂简易故事、对话及新闻的自学者。

本书为指导性教材,旨在指导学生逐步学习、掌握英语听力技能,启发、帮助学生在听英语时能自觉地运用听母语的一些娴熟方法,并试图从听力训练的角度来培养提高学生的逻辑思维能力、分析能力和综合能力。本教材采取较为集中的练习形式训练听力技能,不过多地讲解语言现象和文化背景知识。学生在掌握听力基本方法的基础上可以充分利用广播、电视等英语节目,多听多练,以提高听力理解能力。

本书共分 24 个单元,每单元由两部分组成:

第一部分集中进行单项听力方法训练,内容包括: Finding the Main Idea, Making Inferences, Guessing Unknown Words, Predicting, Retaining Details, Listening to News Items.

第二部分由听写和听力欣赏穿插组成。听力欣赏取材于世界各地名胜古迹、中外历史人物、西方风 土人情等题材;听写部分包括填空、去掉多余的字、段落听写等练习形式。

由于第一部分的训练材料不可避免地侧重文章段落,因此第二部分的练习多选用对话形式,帮助学生了解对话的特点,提高听对话的能力。

本书配有教师参考书,编有练习答案和补充听力材料。补充听力材料的内容包括:小故事、听写和对话,供课外练习或欣赏。
