#### 前 言

《大学英语教学大纲》具体提出各级英语词汇量的要求,并附出《大学英语词汇表》。学生掌握词汇量的多寡,直接关系到他们的语言交际能力(首先是阅读能力)的高低。为了有效地帮助学生记忆和巩固课内外所学词汇,强化词汇应用训练(如释义、辨义、填词、选词等),使学生掌握和领会《大纲》规定的各类词汇,我们根据《大纲》词汇表中5400个(包括理工科与综合大学文理科)单词编出《大学英语词汇(1-6级)综合测试题》[PRACTICE TESTS FOR COLLEGE ENGLISH VOCABULARY (Levels 1~6)]。

《大学英语词汇(1~6级)——综合测试题》分三册。每册词汇复盖面为1800个左右。第一册属基础部分(Elementary),着重《词汇表》中标有 \* 号的与部分没标号的词汇,第二册属中级部分(Intermediate)着重没标号的与小部分标有△号的词汇,第三册属高级部分(Advanced)着重标有△号的与部分没标号的词汇\*。还增加了少量虽未列入《词汇表》但属常用的单词。

一、二两册适合大学一、二年级学生检测应用,为应各

级学生需用,现先付出版一、二册。每册包括十组测试题。 每组测试题采用选词填充、同义词替换、短文综合填充与短 文填词等形式,选材大部分取自国内外最新出版的英语练习 用测试材料与阅读训练材料。安排上力求由浅入深,用语合 乎规范,文体多样、内容新颖。

本书设计上的特点是把大纲词汇表中的单词按级编成四个部分的试题,单词分散在各项试题中,通过上下文使学生掌握词的用法,通过动脑、动手挑出或填出一个具体的词,从而提高他们使用词语的实际能力及应考能力。

我们认为词汇与阅读是相辅相成的,加强词汇练习可以促进阅读理解能力的提高,通过一定量的阅读又可以巩固对词汇的掌握。这也正好是本书的宗旨。在编写过程中,为了使5400个左右的词汇分别以试题形式出现在句子、短文中,确实碰到不少技术上的问题,编写本书仅仅是一种尝试,但我们相信,它的出版对各类院校的本科生、研究生报考者、出国预备生及英语自学者掌握和检测大纲规定的5400个单词都会有所帮助。

本书是在我校教务处与外语教学部的鼓励与支持下编写的, 承外文系陈福生教授审稿, 外语教学部副教授张承襄校阅, 在此一并致谢。由于我们经验不足, 水平有限, 仓促成书, 不足之处和错误在所难免, 请读者批评指正, 以便再版时进一步修改。
