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前 言

国家教育委员会审定批准的《大学英语教学大纲》对非英语专业本科学生的英语听力提出了明确的要求。为使学生切实达到《大纲》规定的听力水平，向他们提供足够的听力材料，我们编写了这套 *Further Listening* 英语听力训练书。

Further Listening 题材多样，语言真实，无论对话或短文，内容都生动有趣，大多反映当代英美日常生活。它在内容和深浅程度方面与我校大学外语教学部编写的大学英语听力教程 *Focus Listening* 基本相同。但 *Further Listening* 是供学生课外泛听用的，它在选材长度、编写体例和练习要求等方面有其自己的特点，有的语速也略快于《大纲》规定的指标。

Further Listening 全套六册。本书是第一册，计 20 课，每课有数篇对话和短文。对话和短文之前有 Learning Points (包括 Vocabulary, Useful Expressions 和 Notes)。学生在听之前，须对这部分进行预习。每篇对话和短文之后，配有练习。学生做完练习后，可根据所给的评分标准计算自己的成绩。书后附有音带的文字和练习答案。

本书音带为 60 分钟盒式磁带三盒。
