

Combining education with recreation, this songbook contains over 160 songs with more than 2000 English words, expressions and sentences. 前　　言

我已年逾古稀，退休赋闲多年。

近几年来，我编配了二百多首英汉双语记词忆句歌曲，希望对英汉语言的学习者有所帮助。本歌曲集先行选收了 160 多首出版，并配有录音。每首歌曲的歌词下面标有国际音标和汉语拼音，可方便学习者轻松记词，减少遗忘。本书既适用于中国的中小学生及成人初学者学英语，也适用于懂英语的外国人学汉语。我这样做如能对国际交流带来点益处，则不胜欣喜。

本书旨在寻求一种轻松便捷、寓教于乐的英 / 汉语学习方法。英语学习者能在简洁悦耳的旋律中轻松自然地记住原本枯燥乏味的英语词句。而对那些想学汉语但在浩瀚的汉字词库面前望而却步的国际友人们，本书为他们提供了一条学汉语的便捷途径。随书的录音，有如给学习者配备了合格的语言“教师”。他们可以随时随地听，便于学唱。反复地听录音还可以使他们了解有关词的认知意义及它们在不同搭配下的特殊含义。

这些歌既不是抒情歌曲，也不是音乐欣赏歌曲，它们是简单易学的语言学习记词忆句歌曲。一般的英语歌曲，一个音符下只有一个语音单位，也就是说，歌词应该按音节分列在相对应的音符下面，这样唱起来方便顺畅。我在本歌曲集的处理方法则是采用了汉语歌曲的做法，把英语以词为单位列在音符下面，学习者可自行按单词音节唱出每个音符下面的词来，只要有点音乐简谱和国际音标知识，学唱者看上歌曲便能唱出，非常适合初学者。

学习汉语的国际友人对着音符唱汉语方块字，他们会很快地习惯于汉语的一字一音，方便记词忆句。

我的歌曲多数简短易学，歌词内容涵盖单词、句型（日常用语）以及一些体育和外事用语。英语单词和句型歌词均按中小学英语教材编写，但是按语法分类编排，这样就不受教材变更所限。我编配的这些歌曲，主要目的是为帮助学习者记词忆句、寓学于乐，在英语音标的标注上采取了尽量简化的方式。

在编写过程中得到了专家、教授等诸多老师的认可、支持、鼓励和帮助。我国著名的外语教育家、北京外国语大学陈琳教授热情地接待了我，赠给我他近期出版的书和录音带，并给予我鼓励，说我的歌“是小小的创造发明”；山西大学外语学院原副院长、应用语言学及 ELT 硕士生导师刘海量教授为本书作序、翻译并提出涉及各方面的建议；山西外语教师协会副会长、太原五中特级教师刘锐诚老师和“疯狂英语”创始人李阳老师都给过我极大的鼓励和鞭策。对以上诸位老师可贵的支持和帮助，在此我一并深表谢意。

由于本人英语、音乐水平有限，疏漏和不当之处一定不少，诚望使用本书的朋友见谅，并惠予指正，本人将不胜感谢！

Foreword

Now aged 75 years old, I've been retired from office for years.

During recent years, I've spent nearly all the time I can spare setting to simple music over 200 bilingual English-Chinese songs hoping to help English and Chinese language learners better learn the two languages. Included in the present songbook are a choice selection of about 160 songs, accompanied with their recordings. Under the words of each song, international phonetic alphabets are given for English and pinyin (phonetic symbols) for Chinese. By so doing, I just intend to make the learning of the two languages easier and more enjoyable. The songbook has been prepared mainly for Chinese primary/secondary school pupils and adult beginners to learn English as well as for foreigners who already know English to learn Chinese. I would feel happy if it proves of some use for international communication.

This songbook has combined education with recreation. English learners can quickly memorize those seemingly dry and dull English words and sentences through the simple and pleasant melody of the music. Foreign friends who want to learn Chinese can take a shortcut when they are shrinking back at the sight of the vast and numerous Chinese lexicon. The accompanied recordings offer learners capable and certified "teachers". They can listen to them as they see fit and further listening will enable them to understand not only the cognitive meanings of the words concerned but also the special meanings when used in different combinations.

The songs in this songbook are neither lyric songs nor music songs for appreciation. They are simple language learning songs which can help learners quickly memorize words and expressions. In English songs, as we know, there is just one phonetic unit under one music score. In order to sing easily and smoothly, words under the music scores should be separated according to syllables. I have adopted here in this songbook a method by which Chinese songs are arranged. I just put English words under the music

scores without separating them syllabically. Learners can sing them according to syllables. They can easily learn to sing if only they have a basic knowledge of the numbered musical notation and the international phonetic alphabet (IPA). For foreigners learning Chinese, they will soon get used to the monosyllabic Chinese characters when they sing out the characters under the music scores.

Most songs here are simple, short and easy to learn. The content covers from words and expressions in daily use to some special terms used in physical culture and in the management of foreign affairs. English vocabulary and sentence patterns used as the words of the songs have been mainly chosen from the present middle-school English textbooks. They are classified according to grammar and thus not influenced by the changing of textbooks. The main aim of these songs is to help English/Chinese learners memorize words and expressions. When I give the English phonetic symbols I adopt the very simple ways to transcribe the English words.

During the whole process of preparing the songbook, I have received recognition, support, encouragement and help from the following teachers and professors. Prof. Chenglin, one of the well known foreign language educationists in China and a famous professor from Beijing Foreign Studies University ,encouraged me to finish the work; Prof. Liu Hailiang, former vice-dean of Foreign Language School, Shanxi University, wrote a preface to the songbook and offered expert advice to me on all matters. Ms Liu Ruicheng, a special-class teacher of English from The 5th Middle School of Taiyuan, and Mr. Li Yang, the founder of Crazy English, all gave me encouragement and spurred me to greater efforts. Here I'd like to express my heartfelt thanks to all of them.

Owing to my defects in language and music ability, there are bound to be oversights and mistakes in this songbook. I'll be very much obliged to readers and users of the songbook for their valuable comments.

关于为何不按正常英语歌编“记词歌”的说明

凡学过外语的人都尝过记词难的苦头，20世纪五六十年代我国重视俄语，轻视英语，所以人们想尽办法来弥补。连过去学外语最反对用汉字标音的方法也用上了，这可以解决会说普通话的人学外语的困难，也起了相当大的作用。我的老父亲说他们那时就用“三个牛拉着马车”的歪打正招法记“Thank you very much”。

我是用大众通俗易学的简谱形式和初学者熟悉的汉语一字一音的语言习惯谱曲编歌，帮助记词，并标上国际音标和汉语拼音，编成中国人能学英语、外国人通过英语学汉语的双向服务的教辅书。有助于英语初学者和汉语初学者提高各自的水平，也对国际交流有所裨益。它经济实用，便于推广普及。

英语是多音节的拼音文字，可以在一个音符下唱出好几个音的词来，单音节的词不能分在几处，而辅音词尾又不能拖长音，只有唱出来时才知其所在音符下的位置，这对初学者来说很难唱准确，所以我就按一字一音的汉语习惯编写。一个词能发几个音就尽量给配上几个音符，等于给音符增加了一个记发音数字的任务，但伴奏时则同样的音符就不要全部弹奏出来。节拍不错就行。一个词需分几处时，不按音节分，而是按能拼在一起的字母就放在一起，辅音词尾就放在其唱出来时所在的

音符下。这样从书面上看是不符合英语语法，但唱出来时和正常的英语歌一样。还有英语歌词中的阿拉伯数字，只有改为英语数字才能学唱。这就是这部记词歌曲的特点。学汉语者也需要逐步地熟悉汉语一字一音的习惯，因而本书也适合汉语初学者学唱。

总之，这是一种为沟通两种语言的学习过程的歌曲，不是正常的英语歌曲，而且外国人也能学汉语。真可谓“一举两得”。这是名副其实的记词歌曲，不能要求过高。难道记词不是个难题吗？更主要的是这种歌便于推广普及，可鼓励更多的少年或成人初学者学外语。
