

序

新课程标准倡导任务型教学模式。任务型教学(Task-Based Learning, 简称 TBL)是在 20 世纪 80 年代外语教学法研究者和第二语言习得研究者在大量研究和实践的基础上提出来的又一个有重要影响的语言教学途径。它以具体任务为学习动力或动机,以完成任务的过程为学习的过程,以展示任务成果的方式(而不是以测试的分数)来体现教学的成就。它要求学生在教师的指导下,通过感知、体验、实践、参与和合作等方式,实现任务的目标,感受成功,并在学习过程中进行情感和策略调整,以形成积极的学习态度,促进语言实际运用能力的提高,学会用英语做事,培养交际能力。一句话,英语任务型教学就是让学生"用英语去做事",使学生通过大量的伙伴活动和小组活动获得语言运用的机会。而任务型教学中一个很重要的组成部分就是任务型阅读。

任务型阅读是 21 世纪才在初中英语中考试题中出现的新题型,着重强调考查考生的实际"动手"能力。任务型阅读理解题所选文章题材真实可靠,内容贴近现代社会生活,涉及学校和社会,富有时代气息,语言原汁原味,主要以广告、海报、通告等应用文体为主。它往往与生活实际挂钩,涉及天气预报、电视节目、门票、预订房间、机票、填写申请表格、广告、确定方位、排列顺序等生活实例和有关日常生活话题的简短文字材料,以及书、报、杂志中关于一般性话题的简短文章等。阅读内容浅显,易于把握,体现了运用语言完成实际任务的目的,且有时图文并茂,符合不同层次学生的心理爱好。题目设计既不直接呈现答案,也不增添解题的难度。该题型主要考查收集信息、整理信息的能力,是对语言运用能力的

考查。完成这一题型应非常细致,十分认真地从原材料中收集有用的信息,并且经过整理后输出信息。任务型阅读要求学生在阅读理解的基础上,去完成一项任务或解决一个问题,其要求介于阅读理解与写作之间,要求将语言能力、智力能力和社会阅历三方面的知识相结合,能够有效测试学生运用语言"做事"的能力,符合目前英语教学改革的方向。

陈露老师将自己在英国一年的交流教学工作及生活中所接触 到的大量地道的、原汁原味的英语素材,整理编写出这本任务型阅 读材料书籍,既符合英语教改趋势,又非常实用,很有意义,很有 价值。

全书分旅游、票据、公共标识、海报、邀请函、招聘广告、娱乐等专题,既独立成篇又有机联系,既具时代特点又突出实用价值,相信同学们在学到更地道英语的同时,任务型阅读理解的能力也会有较大提高。这本书将成为广大同学的良师益友。

编者的话

《Around the UK——任务型阅读 120 篇》的付梓,实现了我的一个夙愿。

中国学生学习英语,大多是在一个几乎没有英语语言环境的背景下,背单词、读课文,苦苦地挣扎、悲壮地坚持。作为一名英语教师,我是多么渴望能为他们提供一些原汁原味的语言素材,创造一个相对地道的英语语境;为他们乐学、爱学英语,提高学习效能尽自己的绵薄之力啊。

实现这个愿望的机会终于来临了!

在学校的支持和安排下,我有幸在英国工作、学习和生活了一年,接触并珍存了大量地道的、原汁原味的英语素材。怎样才能不浪费这些宝贵的资源,让这些素材成为学生提高英语学习能力和了解英国风土人情的好材料呢?我萌发了将这些素材整理编写成任务型阅读材料的念头。

我的想法,得到了我校党总支书记、浙江省功勋教师、浙江省 英语特级教师潘志强先生的高度赞同。在繁忙的工作之余,潘先 生还特地多次召集在编撰方面有丰富经验的多位同仁,与我一起 商讨编写的体例、框架,迈开了编撰本书的第一步。

本着顺应目前英语教学改革方向,拓展学生视野,强调语言的实际性、实用性,培养学生的文化意识的宗旨,结合初中生英语学习和初中英语升学毕业考试的实际,我将这些素材分门别类地设计成任务型阅读材料。材料中既有旅游、票据、公共标识、海报、邀请函、招聘广告、娱乐等专题,又有对英国的国花、国歌、国旗、宗教、节日、饮食、交通、休闲等的介绍。它要求学生在阅读理解的基

础上,去完成一项任务或解决一个问题,既考查学生运用语言"做事"的能力,又使学生通过阅读了解了英国的风土人情。通过阅读材料,学生能够体味地道的英语,进一步激发学习英语的兴趣;通过阅读"做事",学生能够提高阅读理解的能力,强化运用语言的能力;通过了解英语国家的文化背景知识,学生能够达到学习语言的最高境界-——文化的学习。

在本书的编写过程中,得到了众多热心人士的关爱。我的好友英国的 Lindsay 女士和 Anthony 先生阅读了全书并提出了许多宝贵建议,市、区两级教研员蒋国补和吕萍老师给予了真诚指导,潘志强书记、林筱华、刘向红、甘衢芳、王嵘、吴菊芳等同事,以及兄弟学校同行们都曾给予鼎力之助。特别感谢在英国有过教学交流工作经验的王芸老师的协助与建议。在此,我十分诚挚地对所有关心和帮助过我的各位领导和朋友致以深深的谢意。

有于时间仓促、学识水平所限,书中难免有谬误之处,敬请广 大读者批评指正!

Part A

Section 1 Tickets

Introduction

In Britain, when people travel by public transport (e.g. train or bus) they will be given a ticket to show they have paid for the journey. It is also common for tickets to be given to customers when pay for a service. For example, when a person goes to the theatre or cinema he/she will be given a ticket to show he/she has paid. Tickets are usually made out of card or paper and are often small so they fit inside a wallet or a purse. Section 1 gives some examples of tickets used in Britain. There are exercises to complete and questions to answer on each example.

1. Ticket types

Ticket types Save money on tickets and book in advance.

A limited number of tickets are available and you must travel on specific trains.

Cheap Day Returns, Supersavers, Savers, SaverFirst and 5-day Network Away Break Save money on fares by travelling on off-peak trains (off-peak is usually during the middle of the day on weekdays and at any time during

First Class Open and Standard Class Open This ticket provides flexibility for you to travel on any train, returning within a month of the outward travel date.

First Day/Standard Day These are peak day-return tickets valid on any train. Available for shorter journeys.

 Season tickets Save money on regular travel with a season ticket. This ticket offers unlimited travel on your chosen route for seven days or for any period from one month to a year. Tickets available from your local station or via the phone booking line.






