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编者说明

《英语实训教程——视听说》(分基础篇与进阶篇) 以语言规范、内容实用、操作性强为原则,围绕求职面试、工作就业、公平竞争等英语常见话题,选取英美电影中的适当片段,让学生有针对性地进行视听说练习,提高学生英语应用能力。材料剪辑情景完整,语言原汁原味,配有英文文字稿并随书提供视频材料光盘;此外,材料语速适中,可理解性强,便于课堂操作,易于学生接受。与同类教材相比,本《视听说》教程特点如下:

- 突出听说技能的培养,注意练习和模仿的并进;
- 内容选择经过实际教学环节的检验,符合学生需要;
- 精心选取 40 部有代表性的英语电影剪辑,语言原汁原味, 充分展现英语文化;
- 影片剪辑完整,语言适合学生进行视听说练习;
- 主题式单元设计配合完整的视频剪辑材料,课堂操作性强;
- 图文并茂,材料生动有趣,能激发学生的学习兴趣。

《英语实训教程——视听说(进阶篇)》共分 10 个单元,每个单元以两部电影为素材,由导入(Warm-up)、基于两部电影主题片段的语言活动(Movie One,Movie Two)、由视听内容拓展出的语言活动(After-class Activity)和补充听力(Supplementary Listening)四大部分组成。具体如下:

Warm-up 为导入部分,包括看图说话、听故事、与主题相关的简单讨论、内容讨论等,旨在激发学生的兴趣,引导学生积极思考。

Movie One 和 Movie Two 包含电影简介 Plot Summary 听力填空,两至四个电影片段,每个片段之后有丰富的听说练习。

After-class Activity 作为单元主题的延伸,包括 Pair Work 及 Group Work 两大块,形式以主题讨论为主,进一步检验和提高学



生的口语能力。

Supplementary Listening 选取主题相关材料,设置了相应的 听力填空与问答题。

与《英语实训教程——视听说(基础篇)》相比,本册内容更丰 富, 题量更大, 活动更多样化, 话题更具开放性。编写了选择、判 断、听力填空、复述、问答、辩论、改写、角色扮演等多种形式; 学生自由发挥的程度大:图文并茂,综合训练学生的听说能力。

本教材视听内容丰富, 教师可以根据实际情况选择全部内容或 挑选感兴趣、易操作的内容。教材可供一个学期使用, 也可供一学 年使用。每个单元一般可以安排2~4个学时。

本教程既可供高职高专非英语专业学生选修使用,也可供英语 专业学生必修课使用。《进阶篇》要求学生初步具备听说能力,能进 一步提高其英语实用技能。

《英语实训教程》总主编为盛湘君。本册主编吴忠齐,副主编 盛一英。朱静娴、钱丽莉、刘青、李炜参与了本书的编写, 并由美 籍教师 Greg Halak 校稿。本书的录音由美国语言专家 Dr. John Meny 先生朗读。


