

《新概念英语》是一套经典的英语学习教材,它把 许许多多的英语学习者引入了英语的世界,使英语学习 者轻松入门,渐入佳境。由于《新概念英语》在市场上 的持续热销,与它配套的辅导书更是层出不穷,但是这 些辅导书多以课文讲解、语法练习为主,忽视了对学习 者背诵方面的训练。《新概念英语背背佳》突出背诵, 具有很多同类书籍没有的优势。

### 一、此"背"非彼"背"

提到背书,人们会自然而然地感到枯燥、乏味、头痛、头晕(类似感冒症状)。那种私塾式的死记硬背,不仅对学习兴趣无益,更不利于知识的掌握。而理解后的记忆对于英语学习则是至关重要的。本书帮助学习者克服背诵过程中的痛苦,陪伴学习者共同走过这个艰苦但有益的过程,并使之趣味横生。本书让学习者自自然然地背,明明白白地背,津津乐道地背!

#### 二、四大板块助您一臂之力

本书内容紧扣《新概念英语》学生用书的内容,每 课都包含四个板块。这四个板块各具特色,相得益彰。

大意我先知:百字左右的文章大意使学习者在背诵 前先对全文有个大概的了解,做到心中有数。并且 有的文章很有趣,看过大意后,您肯定想去亲自领 略一下原文的魅力。

原汁原味: 这里为您呈现的是教材原文,并配有地 道的美语录音。该部分对课文中重点词汇和短语进



行了加粗处理,使学习者在阅读时对于文章的重点、难点一目了然。学习者在背诵时,可模仿该部分的美语录音,不仅能锻炼听力,更能纠正某些不正确发音。

小解小译:每篇文章中的难句、长句、复杂句和重 点句型都会在这里得到解析,并且大部分句子后都 附有中文翻译,以帮助学习者铲除背诵过程中阅读 理解方面的障碍,从而达到顺畅背记。

**背后秀秀看**:这是给学习者搭建的舞台,背过之后还要秀一秀。本板块给出了文章中的重点连词、时间状语,其他部分用横线代替,以便学习者自我检测背诵效果。

除了这四个板块之外,还有一个"背友小心得"栏目会不时出现。这个栏目不仅为您介绍了背诵方法,教您如何排除困难,还为您加油鼓劲,语言亲切幽默,为您的背诵过程增添几分乐趣。

本书的编写团队是由有着丰富的新概念英语教学经验的教师组成,他们了解学习者的学习困难,熟悉新概念英语教材的精髓之处,所以书中释疑、点拨之处均能做到恰到好处。本书既可以作为英语学习书籍单独使用,也可与《新概念英语》教材配套使用。

总之,学习英语离不开一定量的背记。无论是单词,还是句型,抑或是名篇佳作,都是很好的开端,只要您相信英语背背佳,背背英语会更佳!

#### A Puma at Large

Pumas are large, cat-like animals which are found in America. When reports came into London Zoo that a wild puma had been **spotted** forty-five miles south of London, they were not taken seriously. However, as the evidence began to **accumulate**, experts from the Zoo **felt obliged to** investigate, **for** the descriptions given by people who claimed to have seen the puma were extraordinarily similar.

The hunt for the puma began in a small village where a woman picking blackberries saw "a large cat" only five yards away from her. It immediately ran away when she saw it, and experts confirmed that a puma will not attack a human being unless it is cornered. The search proved difficult, for the puma was often observed at one place in the morning and at another place twenty miles away in the evening. Wherever it went, it left behind it a trail of dead deer and small animals

like rabbits. Paw prints were seen in a number of places and puma fur was found clinging to bushes. Several people complained of "cat-like noises" at night and a businessman on a fishing trip saw the puma up a tree. The experts were now fully convinced that the animal was a puma, but where had it come from? As no pumas had been reported missing from any zoo in the country, this one must have been in the possession of a private collector and somehow managed to escape. The hunt went on for several weeks, but the puma was not caught. It is disturbing to think that a dangerous wild animal is still at large in the quiet countryside. (273 words)

In the most sacred room of the temple, clay fragments of fifteen statues were found. Each of these represented a goddess and had, at one time, been painted.
