策划编辑: 倪琴芬 责任编辑: 唐 敏 2002年,教育部启动了新一轮的大学英语教学改革。这次改革的重心是提高学生的 英语听说能力,解决长期以来备受社会指责的"哑巴英语"教学模式,使学生在未来的学 习、工作和社会交往中能用英语进行有效的交流,并使他们成为在国际舞台上有作为和活 跃的高素质人才。教育部同时修改了《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》,改革了大学英语 四、六级考试的题型和内容。修改后的《大学英语课程教学要求》明确提出,大学英语教学 的重点从培养学生阅读和写作能力为主转向培养学生的听说能力为主。改革后的大学英 语四、六级考试大幅度提高了英语听力的比重,而且听力考题材料都是鲜活的原始视听 材料。

为满足大学英语教学改革的需要,我们遵循《大学英语课程教学要求》,编写了这套《21 世纪大学新英语视听说教程》,供高等学校本科生视听说课程使用。本教程以功能意念贯穿 始终,采用视、听,说、写相结合的方法,充分利用现代计算机技术、网络技术和先进的教学手 段,旨在全面提高学生的英语视听说和写作能力。

本套教材有以下特点。

- 造村真实,取材广泛: 所有視听说语料都选自近期英美国家主要媒体的新闻报道、人物访谈、热点话题讨论和励志故事等。选材融知识性,趣味性和真实性于一体,语言贴近现实生活。真实的语音材料能够激发学生的学习动力和潜力。
- 2. 任务导向,交际为本: 本套数材配有大量的课堂活动,有些需在教师组织下来完成,有 些要学生自由去发挥。所练内容与视听内容紧密相联, 听、说、写融为一体, 更加有效地操练 语言输出技能, 培养学生的英语综合应用能力。
- 3. 由浅入深, 骶序渐进。本套數材共四册。第一、二册重点在听力策略和交际技能的培养,在练习形式、取材难度和内容方面充分考虑了与高中英语的衔接, 所用材料贴近学生的生活, 生动有趣, 学生易于接受。第三、四册突出视听后语言输出能力的培养, 练习形式多样、生动活泼, 围绕口语和写作活动展开。
- 4. 寓教于乐,以經證学:爱因斯坦有句名言:"兴趣是最好的老师。"本套數材除了收编 大量能够激发学生学习兴趣的音、视频材料外,每个单元都设计了"Fun Time"部分,让学生在 紧张学习之余充分放松,尽享英语学习给他们带来的乐趣。

《21世纪大学新英语视听说教程》包括 4 册学生用书和 4 册教师用书。每册包括 16 个单元,其中 14 个单元用于课堂教学,2 个单元用于复习测试。每个单元集中—个主题,供 2 学时教学使用。

第一、二册在单元由以下五个部分组成。

第一部分为"交际技能"(Communication Skills)。本部分包括《大学英语课程数学要求》中所有的日常会话主题,侧重会话策略和功能训练,将养学生的综合语言运用能力。

第二部分为"听力策略"(Listening Strategy)。本部分侧重培养学生的听力技能,通过专项练习,辅以相关英语听力学习策略指导,帮助学生尽快掌握专项听力技能。

第三部分为"与主题相关的视听说活动"(Theme-related Activities)。本部分通过各种视 听说活动来训练学生的语言基本技能,同时也兼顾到四级网考的一些考试形式。

第四部分为"课外视听"(Home Listening & Watching)。此部分既有音频材料也有视频材料,为学生提高自主学习能力搭建了一个很好的平台。

第五部分为"轻松一刻"(Fun Time)。此部分多以与主题相关的影视精彩片段或流行歌曲等为视听材料,让学生在紧张之余充分放松,尽享英语学习之乐。

第三、四册每单元由以下六个部分组成

第一部分为"导人"(Lead-in)。本部分的目的是让学生通过回答问题或图片讨论,对所 学单元主题有所了解,通过独身进入最佳学习状态。

第二部分为"视与听"(Watching & Listening)。本部分侧重训练学生对有一定长度和难 度的音、视频材料的理解,并在学习过程中培养学生对英美文化的初步了解。

第三部分为"视听与说"(Watching/Listening & Speaking)。本部分旨在培养学生的英语 口语表达能力,口语练习与视听内容紧密相扣,活动形式多样,话题贴近日常生活。

第四部分为"视听与写"(Watching/Listening & Writing)。本部分侧重培养学生英语写作 技能。第三册要求学生对视听材料内容进行书面概括和综述,第四册则在此基础上要求学生 对视听内容进行评论。

第五部分为"轻松一刻"(Fun Time)。此部分多以与主题相关的影视精彩片段或流行歌曲等为视听材料,让学生在紧张之余充分放松,尽享英语学习之乐。

第六部分为"课外视听"(Home Listening & Watching)。本部分为课堂教学的拓展,旨在培养学生的自主学习能力。

《21 世纪大学新英语视听说教程》主要由北京交通大学和西安交通大学等高校的资深教 授和英语教学专家通力合作编写而成。在本教材的构思、编写和审稿过程中,国内外很多学 者向我们提出了不少宝贵的建议,花费了大量时间修改稿件,在此我们全体编写人员向他们 致以诚挚的感谢。
