- 二、宗司按內容分成综合部分和地区国别史两大奖。凡不属于个别国家历史的文章与资料的短录,均纳入综合部分,并按所属的断代及内容特列。如古代近末史入古代史,十字写东便则入中世纪史等;涉及阿国关系的文章分别列入国别史类的主导国家的栏目之下。如"1315~1846年实国对德勒两间域的态度",列入美国。涉及多国关系的询列入综合类中国际关系一样。如克里采亚员争等。
- 三、在图别反类,本意引与启到某些图象的文章、资料的数量不 多,不宜单独列品图别,而列入该国所属的别别或是区的栏目内。某 些图象的文章、资料的数量参多,为使于使用。更分列断代与专题。
- 四、海船本刊机的特点。目别结后次序以其文章和资料数量的多 **宴排列;人物则**接起氏的英文字母顺序编辑。
- 五、为似于读者查找原文, 本常切较细的杂目卷注明年代和卷次, 如1978, 37-4, 即为1978年第37卷第4期。
- 六、本案引由為面华自志负责收益、系制。由于大平阶限。难免 有经误和遗漏之处。语予以流评指正。
