编者说明

一、《美国历史评论》由美国历史学会主编，刊载有关世界历史的论文、资料、评论及书评等。本索引收编自1895年创刊号至1982年37卷4期止的有关文章和资料的题录约1300条，供世界史工作者从事科研和教学工作时参考。

二、索引按内容分成综合部分和地区国别史两大类。凡不属于个别国家历史的文章与资料的题录，均纳入综合部分，并按所属的断代及内容排列。如古代近东史入古代史，十字军东侵则入中世纪史等；涉及两国关系的文章分别列入国别史类的主导国家的栏目之下。如“1815~1846年美国对俄勒冈问题的态度”，列入美国。涉及多国关系的则列入综合类中国际关系一栏。如克里米亚战争等。

三、在国别史类，本索引考虑到某些国家的文章、资料的数量不多，不宜单独列出国别，而列入该国所属的洲别或地区的栏目内。某些国家的文章、资料的数量较多，为便于使用，再分列断代与专题。

四、根据本刊物的特点，国别先后次序以英文文章和资料数量的多寡排列；人物则按姓氏的英文字母顺序编排。

五、为便于读者查找原文，本索引收编的条目都注明年代和卷次，如1978，37-4，即为1978年第37卷第4期。

六、本索引由梅丽华同志负责收集、编辑，由于水平所限，难免有错误和遗漏之处，请予以批评指正。
