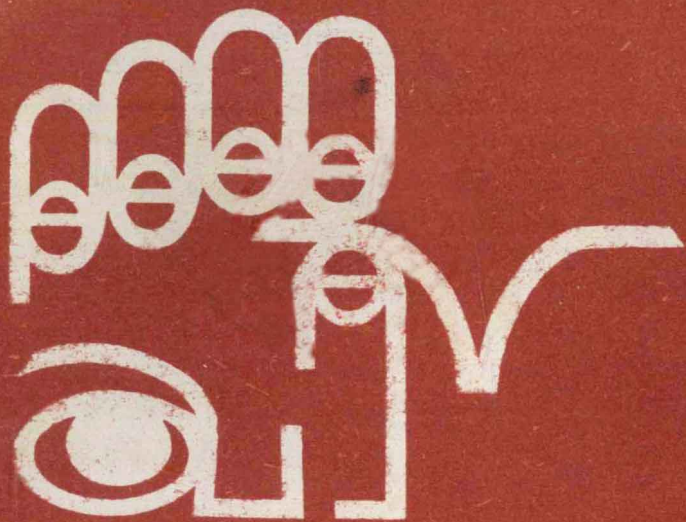

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## 编 者 的 话

完形填空(cloze test) 是英语标准化考试(MET) 试题中检查考生多种语言能力的综合性测试形式。它要求考生从整个语段的内容、组织结构和语言特点出发, 全面考虑问题, 综合运用所学词汇、语法知识和生活常识准确选择答案, 使完型填空后的文章不仅语法知识正确无误, 用词恰当, 而且意思、结构完整合理, 前后一致。因此, 完形填空题的难度大于 MET 其它类型考查题, 成为学生最感困难、最难把握的题型之一。为了帮助学生熟悉这一题型的特点, 掌握解题方法和技巧, 我们根据新颁《全日制中学英语教学大纲》的要求和学生实际, 选编了这本《完形填空100例》, 供广大中学英语教师及学生选择使用。

选入本书的文章大都出自国外较新的教材和报刊杂志, 内容力求丰富多采, 题材尽量广泛新颖。难度适中, 文中生词用中文注释。空词频度、分布的设计亦尽量做到科学、合理。在保证文章总体结构完整的前提下, 注意了对深层内容的考查, 以求提高学生透过表层结构对深层结构隐含意思的理解能力。

本书适用于高中各年级, 尤其对高三学生帮助更大, 学生可根据自己程度选择使用。

由于编者水平有限, 书中难免有谬误之处, 恳请广大读者批评指正。
