乡时他们会将我的画带给孩子作纪念,带到河北、安徽、四川、山东、湖南或者更远的地方。他们的笑容,我永生难忘。

有个来自北京的高中女生与我同在那间咖啡屋,她专心致志地看着书。中途她起身去点餐,突然走到我面前递来一杯咖啡,表示十分赞赏我的所作所为。她说自己正在备战高考,而后她接着说,"我希望自己能像你一样成功,我也想学心理学去帮助那些汶川地震的灾民。"

Some were perhaps migrant workers who had been working on the Beijing Olympic center also known as the Bird's Nest. Maybe they were going to take my drawings back to their hometowns in Hebei, Anhui, Sichuan, Shandong or Hunan or other far places, as souvenirs for their kids. They all smiled and I shall never forget that moment of my life.

A high school girl from Beijing, who was studying her books rigorously, with undivided attention, left her chair to buy something and suddenly got close to my table and handed me a cup of coffee and appreciated my act. She explained that she was preparing for her university entrance exam. She then added:



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As they say, there is a time for everything, and also a picture is worth thousand words.






"From the parents who were once Olympian and think and act as Olympians we can expect kids only with Olympic spirit," Boboli says.
