本书以社交场合的实际交流为源头,进行分析、归纳、提炼和精心设计,并引入了全国英语口语大赛的考试题型。全书共十个单元,每单元都由 Introduction、Vocabulary Link、Practice Field、Listening Course 及 Enjoy Yourself 五个部分组成,内容涉及问候、介绍、旅游、工作、会议、商务接待、餐饮、酒店服务及娱乐等。本书排版精美、图文并茂,旨在通过真实而富有时代气息的场景、地道而又生动的语言、实用而又丰富的知识、多样而又有趣的练习来提高学生的英语听说能力。

本书是专门为高等院校非英语专业基础英语课程编写的口语教材,以教育部颁布的《高等教育英语课程教学要求》为指南,从高校教学的特点和培养目标出发,在从事多年高校英语教学经验的基础上,结合有关英语口语的特点编写。

"英语听说"课程是基础英语课程的一个重要补充,针对学生开口难、缺乏参与意识、习惯被动听讲等问题,选取了当前学生比较感兴趣和热门的话题,从校园生活到毕业后工作的实际需要,注重培养学生的听说能力,帮助学生在用英语交流的环境中建立信心,启发和创造环境使学生用口语表达个人观点,学习英语口语的常用句型,扩充英语口语交流的词汇,同时在听力环节的训练下,提高听力水平和语言鉴赏能力。

本书由学生用书、教师用书以及配套的资源光盘组成,具体特点如下。

- (1) 实用性。本书以社交场合的实际交流为源头,经分析、归纳和提炼,精心设计了一组典型、综合、实用的任务,涉及餐饮、购物、旅游、求职和商务等典型的情境,并根据学生的认知规律和任务的难易程度安排教材内容。每个单元划分为 5 个模块的训练项目,内容包括: I. Introduction、II. Vocabulary Link、III. Practice Field、IV. Listening Course 和 V. Enjoy Yourself。
- (2) 时效性。本书内容选题新颖,体现了时代特征,有助于学生了解当前口语表达的新理念和社交活动最新发展动态。本书同时将全国英语口语大赛的考试题型引入课堂,构建"英语听说"课程的内容体系,针对口语大赛的竞赛形式设计学习情境,以竞赛的实际场景为背景组织教学内容,训练学生的应变能力。
- (3) 创新性。在本书每个章节的编写内容上,通过知识背景的介绍进行过渡性练习热身,逐步引导学生进入主题学习。在词汇扩展环节中,通过课文的学习提高阅读能力,扩充学生的词汇量;同时,在文章篇章的选择上紧扣单元口语主题,通过项目训练,使学生在文章中学、在文章中练,培养学生综合运用语言表达观点、交流情感的能力。在语言训练环节中,加强重点句型的训练,同时配以任务型对话、图片描述和图片交流进行辅助训练。

- (4)体验性。本书以学生社会生活和职场工作中的实际需求为主线,有目的地将英语语言知识贯穿到生活、学习、社会实践过程中,让学生在口语表达的过程中学习英语语言文化和社交常识。 在课程内容设计上,充分考虑学生的个性发展,保留学生的自主选择空间,兼顾学生的职业发展。
- (5) 趣味性。本书在听力模块中细分为英文歌曲、英文电影、英文对话和英文篇章练习 4 个部分。每部分的练习均配有英文原声录音材料。英文歌曲和电影的片段不仅丰富了教学内容,调动了学生的学习兴趣,更营造出英语语言环境,提高学生口语表达能力。同时,为了提高学生的阅读兴趣,扩大知识面,特意在每章后添加了英语趣味阅读板块。

本书语言流畅,通俗易懂,各个模块在设计上科学性强,教学内容集学习策略、教学方法于一体,倡导体验、实践、参与、交流和合作学习方式,强调学生通过先易后难的预期目标任务的体验,提高英语的实际表达能力,进而感受成功的学习模式。

本书在编写过程中,得到了天津电子信息职业技术学院教务处韩 寅鹏处长、基础部孙敬东主任的大力支持,在此表示诚挚的感谢。由 于编者水平有限,书中难免存在各种错误,望读者不吝指正。
