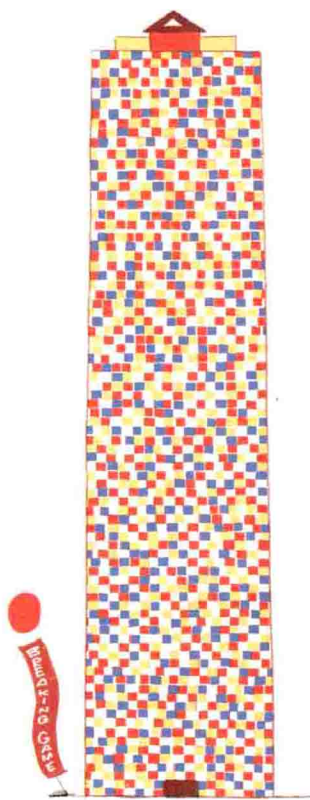

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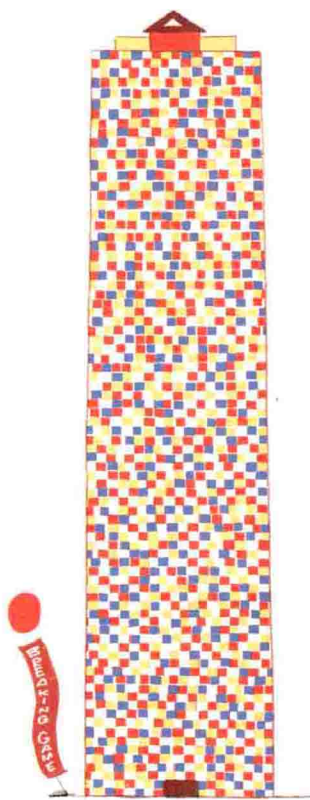
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Parents in Pili-pala Town were very worried about their children, because the children got angry easily. To make things worse, angry children broke everything including tables, chairs, and bowls.

A Breaking Game Is Coming





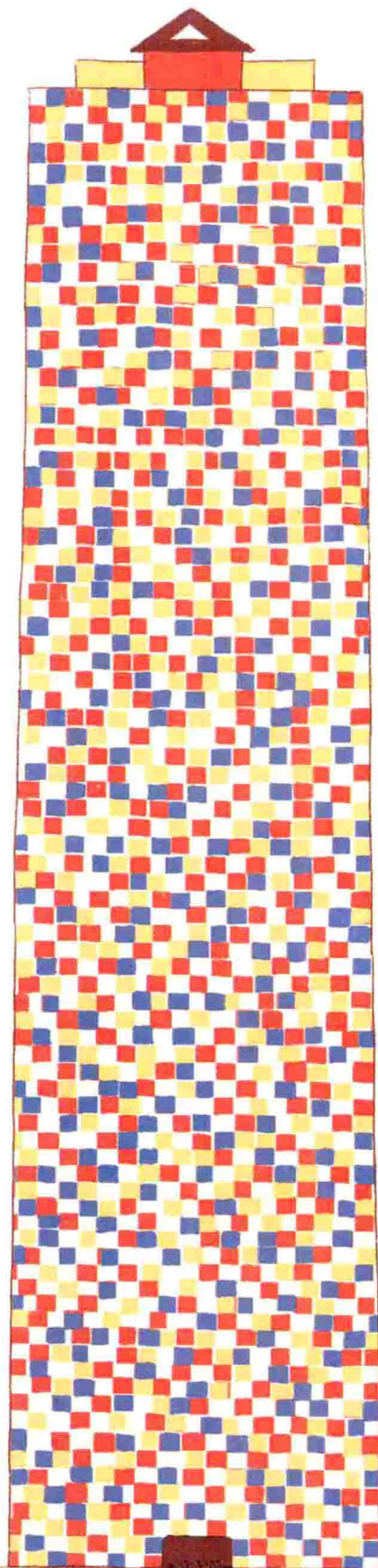

Break everything!"***



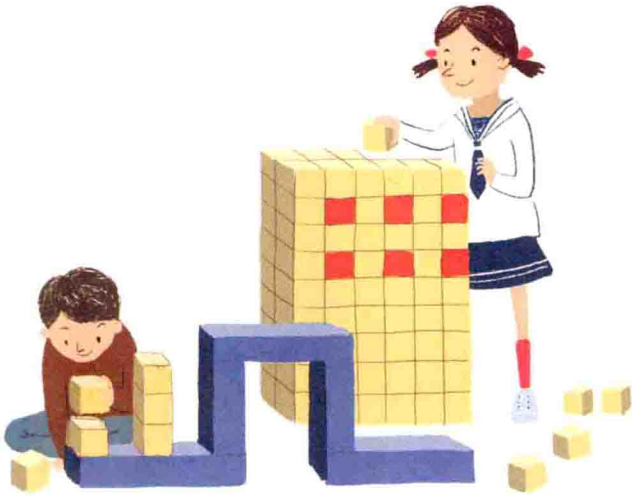
The children ran around,

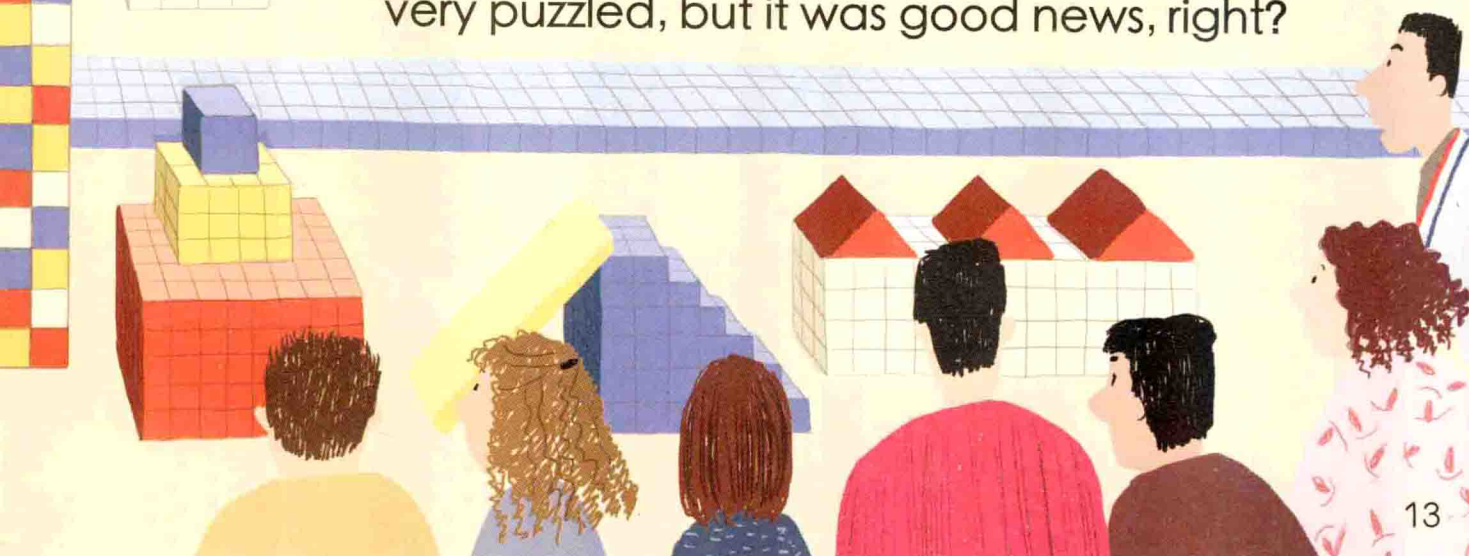


“Wow! We made a new mini Pili-pala Town!”
