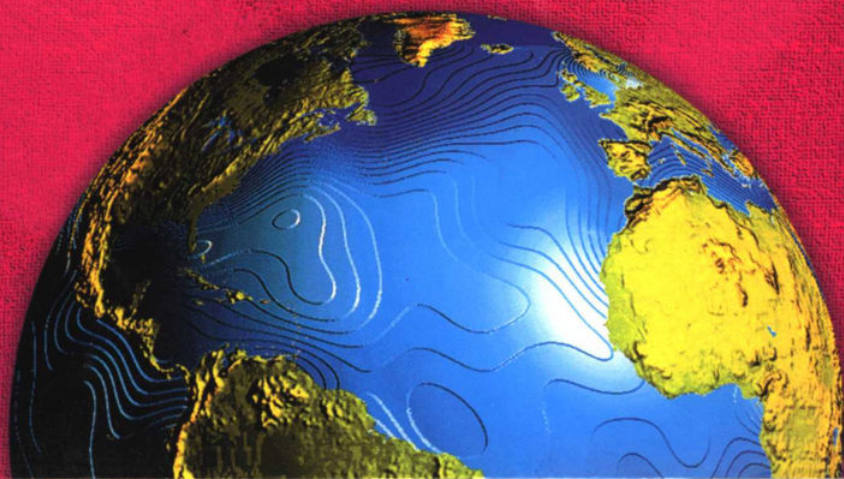


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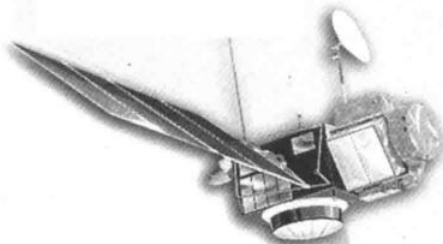
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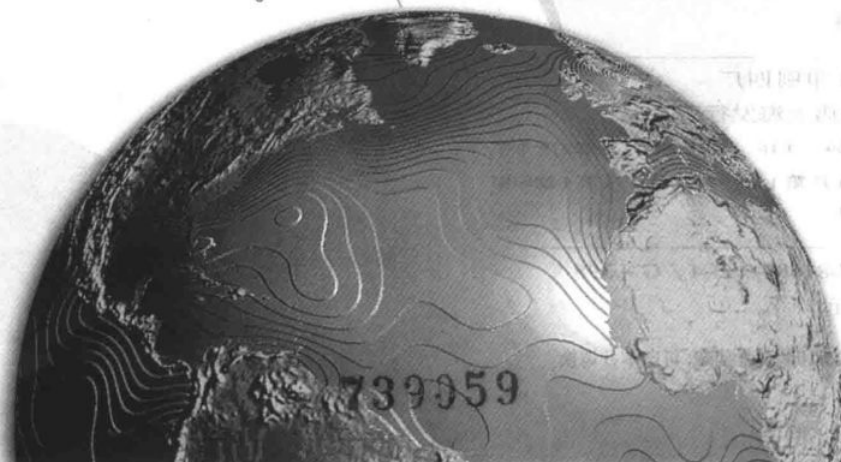

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出版前言

《探索英语》(*Exploring English*) 是英国广播公司 (BBC) 语言教学专家为非英语国家的青少年在学习英语的同时能够全面了解英国文化和生活、提高国际意识而精心编写的教材。该教材问世后, 在世界各地深受欢迎。现由我社引进并改编, 供中国学生使用。

《探索英语》共四级, 每级包括学生用书、练习册和教师用书, 是一套面向中学生 (初一至高三) 或相当水平学习者的教材, 可供学校作为辅助教材使用, 也可供社会办学作为主干教材使用, 或供学习者自学使用。

《探索英语》通过讲述来自世界各国的中学生在英国的生活故事, 向读者介绍了丰富的英国文化和生活知识, 并对比和展现了各国文化生活的特点。教材内容新颖, 图文并茂, 以灵活多样的教学方式帮助学习者在轻松的环境中, 循序渐进地掌握各种英语知识。

本套教材专为以英语为外国语的学习者编写, 采用先进的语言教学法, 以交际法为核心, 促进学习者听、说、读、写、译能力的全面发展, 着重培养学习者的听说能力, 并帮助其了解英语作为一种国际性语言的特色, 增强其用英语参加交际的信心和能力, 使其了解生活圈外的世界中的问题, 更好地理解各种不同的观点。全套教材借助形式多样的书面和口头媒介, 通过各种精心设计的交际任务来提高学习者对口语和书面语的理解能力和表达能力。学生学完本套教材可达到剑桥第一证书 (the First Certificate of English) 要求的水平。
