#### Task 2

The column chart clearly reveals the statistics of students taking part-time jobs in a certain university. According to the survey, there has been a steady increase from 67.77% to 71.93% for students holding temporary jobs from freshmen to juniors,

### Task 3

The two pictures given inform us of the brief history of world commercial fishing. From the upper picture we learn that the year 1900 saw a quite encouraging scene of world fishing: There were a great variety of fishes, but a limited number of fishing-boats in the ocean. However, a worrying change took place in the period of time from 1900 to 1995. As is shown in the lower picture, with the sharp development of world commercial fishing, the ocean became crowded with different kinds of fishing-boats and hence there were few fishes in it. It is clear that a disastrous change occurred in the previous 95 years.

As far as the purposes of the drawer of the pictures are concerned, they are as follows. To begin with, the drawer intends to warn us of the over-exploitation of marine resources, including fish, which will inevitably result in the extinction of many species of marine organisms. Secondly, the drawer aims to draw our attention to the protection of marine resources in every possible way. Finally, the drawer wants, I think, to render the idea that the sea fish resources, which help to keep a large population from being hungry, will be completely ruined if the present situation of overfishing continues at an accelerated rate.

In my opinion, a series of countermeasures should be taken to reverse the current dangerous tendency. On the one hand, the governments throughout the world are supposed to set up as many marine nature reserves as possible to protect marine organisms. On the other hand, it is urgent that the world commercial fishing be put under control because overfishing is one of the factors which are responsible for the present situation. Only in these ways can we protect marine resources from being destroyed some day.

**The Ups and Downs of Population Growth**

As is seen from the two graphs, it is clear that with the rapid growth of U. S. population from 1800 to 1990, the number of its wildlife species no longer existing soared during the same period. Naturally, we can draw the conclusion that the sharp decline of wildlife species resulted from the population growth.

Two reasons may account for this phenomenon. To begin with, as the population grows, people consume much more natural resources, which often leads to excessive hunting. Second, with the increase of human activities, modern people take up more and more space, which has a great impact on other species. More and more animals have to adapt themselves to the decaying environment or move to a totally different place, but not all of them are fortunate enough to survive the changes.

Moreover, common citizens should be aware of this ecological crisis and take on the responsibility of wildlife protection. In a word, only when the government and common people make joint efforts can we hope to find a satisfactory solution to this problem.
