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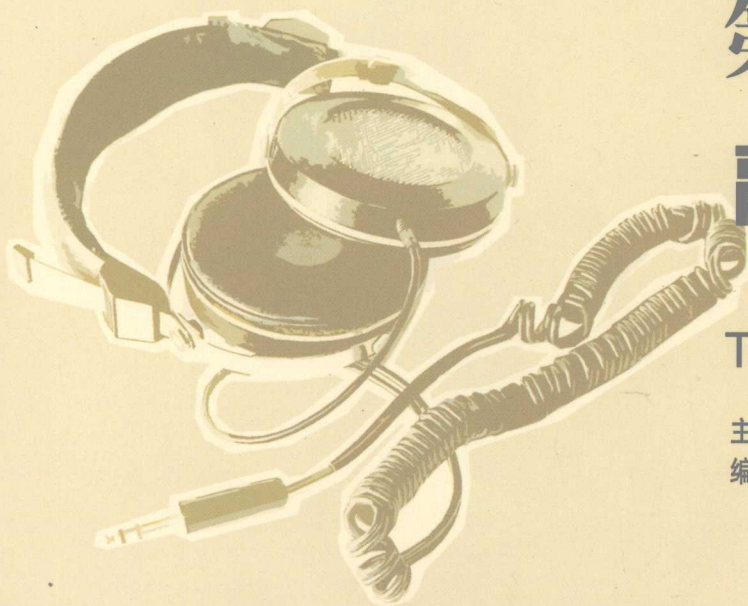

前 言

教育部颁布的《大学英语课程教学要求》，作为大学英语改革的纲领性文件，明确提出要在大学英语的教学过程中培养学生的英语综合应用能力，特别是要加强听说能力的培养，为此我们组织编写了这套《大学英语进阶听力教程》。该教程适应大学英语教学改革形势发展的需要，特别注重训练语言学习者的听力并讲授提高听力方法，以满足广大教师和学生英语学习的新需求。

本套教程分为 6 册，每册重点明确，循序渐进，形成一个有机的整体，系统性强。

第一册《优化音调》的内容有：音素、元音辨识、辅音辨识、辅音连缀、重读与轻读、不完全爆破、同化与省音、连读、意群与停顿、词重音与句子重音、重音转移、节奏及语调。

第二册《稳步前进》含有体育、爱好、家庭、工作、童年、乡村、宠物、影视、大学生活、金钱、音乐、购物、情感、假期和代沟等 15 个主题内容。

第三册《持续发展》含有青春时尚、旅游度假、广告、交通运输、成功与失败、神话传说、电脑、媒体报纸、住房、商业、友谊、身体语言、犯罪和暴力、风俗和休闲等主题内容。

第四册《加速进取》含有著名人士、出国留学、结婚及婚礼习俗、政府机构、科学与技术、暴力及犯罪、环境、演说、诚实、战争与和平、文化、社会问题、语言学习、经济、健康及医疗保险等主题内容。

第五册《融会贯通》内容涉及警句、谚语、习语搭配、幽默、哲理故事集锦、英文歌曲填词、谜语、智力游戏大挑战等。

第六册《应用自如》主要取材于近年来美国之音(VOA)及英国广播公司(BBC)的英语广播节目，涉及的主题多样，与日常生活、社会经济、科技发展等人们普遍关注的问题紧密相关。语言正式、规范，发音清晰，语速由慢及快。

第一、五、六册由于训练目标不同，有所侧重，故自成体系；第二、三、四册体系相同，但训练要求逐步提高，体现在每册选材的难度及语速的阶梯式上升。第二、三、四册均由 Warm-up Exercises、Jogging Exercises、Running Exercises、Dashing Exercises 和 Relaxing Exercises 五个部分组成，但选材的难度及语速形成了一个坡度。

教程以培养和提高学生实际应用语言能力为宗旨,立足于最大限度地调动学习者的积极性和主动性,将语言知识、文化知识和听力技巧有机地结合起来,并巧妙地将教师要讲授的内容纳入教材练习之中,使学习者能根据自己的实际情况有针对性地进行练习,做到有的放矢,有效地提高学习效率。选材注重思想性、时代性、科学性、趣味性和实用性相结合,内容涵盖广泛。背景知识配有简明、有助于理解的注释。每册都附有录音文字材料和练习参考答案并随书附赠录音资料光盘。学习者可根据自己的实际能力和水平,选择听力教程的内容,确定学习进度。修完前4册,相当于达到大学英语课程教学的一般要求。该教程适合在校大学生和具有相当英语水平而又想提高听力的所有人员。由于该教程充分考虑学习者的不同起点和学习进度,使学习者能更有效地利用学习时间,其效果比整齐划一上课要好。

本书是教程的第五册,由张乐、童扬芬、杨畅编写。

本套教程在立项、编写、录音制作的整个过程中得到了华中师范大学教务处的的大力支持与经费上的扶持,特在此表达我们的真诚谢意。
