Foreword

When Professor Xiong Jun told me one year ago that she was going to write a textbook of translation in English, I was as delighted with her daring plan as worried about its possibility of publication, for there had been many excellent textbooks of translation available in China then. To my satisfaction, her final draft has come out. It is quite distinctive and therefore has been accepted by Wuhan University Press for publication in the coming semester. Congratulating her on her success, I would like to say a few words about the textbook.

Speaking from my experience, I think that the book is distinctive in two aspects: completeness and teachability. The aim of this textbook is to put into the students' hands a single volume presenting the fundamentals of all the topics comprised by translation between English and Chinese. It seeks to be reliable, yet interesting; scholarly, yet not pedantic; readily intelligible, yet not a handout. It is the outgrowth of the author's years of teaching and research, many of them devoted to translation. In addition, it also contains a very ample appendix to facilitate finding all transliterations of names. In this sense, I

前 言

“英汉翻译”是目前高等院校英语专业学生的本科学位课程，也是全国英语专业教学大纲规定的必修课程。目的在于让学生了解翻译过程，认识翻译规律，掌握翻译的基本方法和常用技巧，提高英汉互译能力。市面上的翻译教材可谓日新月异、琳琅满目，但绝大多数是用中文编写的，用英语编写的翻译教材不多。作为为英语专业高年级学生开设的专业课，应该用英语讲解，而且这和要求学生用英语写毕业论文是一致的。而市面上学生用书多是中文编写的，翻译课教师参考的也多是中文教材，讲述却用英语，这大大增加了翻译课教师的备课量，也给学生的学习造成了许多不便，同时也不利于学生毕业时用英文写毕业论文。《高等学校英语专业英语教学大纲》(2000: 10)要求，“打好扎实的语言基本功。语言基本功的训练是英语教学的首要任务，必须贯穿于4年教学的全过程”。因此，编者结合自己多年的英汉翻译教学与科研的经验编写了此书，以满足广大学生不断增长的对翻译知识的渴望，以更好地开展翻译教学。

《英汉互译简明教程》(第二版)是一本集翻译理论、翻译技巧、翻译实践于一体的教材，是编者多年英汉翻译教学及科研工作的结晶。本教材根据教育部颁布的《高等学校英语专业英语教学大纲》的要求，在编写过程中注重翻译理论联系实际，强调理论在实践中的应用，重视翻译基本功的训练，注重基础知识的讲解，以增强学生对翻译活动的理性认识；选材多样，内容新颖，信息量大；翻译例句生动有趣，具有典型性和代表性。课后配有练习和答案，方便教师教学和安排学生自学。常用的翻译基本方法和常用技巧的讲解易懂、适用，能让英语专业的学生更好地学习翻译基本功。

本书具有四个特点：

1. 英语行文，突出能力培养，强化实际应用，适应英语专业英语授课教学实际。
2. 立足英汉互译，旨在帮助学生学习和掌握英汉两种语言的差异及英汉互

译的基本理论与翻译技巧。以往的翻译教材往往偏重培养学生英译汉的能力，对汉译英的能力没有强调和重视。

3. 实用性强，用例新又颇具典型性，理论言之有理、持之有据、逻辑严密、结构紧凑。译例丰富鲜活，选材广泛，深入浅出，练习较多，能满足翻译教学与自学译例需要。

4. 具有多功能性，可以作为系统学习翻译的教科书，也可以作为工具书使用。适用于广大英语专业师生、英语自学人员、翻译工作者及爱好者。

全书分为七章，以句子翻译为讲解训练基本单位，英译汉、汉译英并行。第1章概述翻译的定义、分类、历史、走向、译者的必备条件及翻译标准。第2章介绍翻译过程与方法，简明扼要地阐述了语际转换的基本过程和方法。这两章遵循以学生发展为本的理念，对翻译理论只作简要的概述，讲最为基本的翻译理论和方法，让学生知道当前翻译界所关注的理论问题和常用方法是什么，以有效地指导英汉互译翻译实践。第3章着眼于英汉词汇、句式、语篇对比与表达差异，通过比较对照阐述了语际转换的基本规律，为第4章对各种英汉互译技巧的讲解提供了理论关照和依据。第4章就具体的翻译技巧作了详细的阐述和讲解，包括遣词用字法、重译法、增译法、省译法、词类转换法、词序调整法、正说反译反说正译法、语态转换法、分译法与合译法等翻译技巧。第5章讲述英汉长句互译的步骤和方法，以更好地满足学生和社会的需要。第6章讲授英汉书名和文章名的翻译。第7章介绍了习语、菜肴、广告、旅游文本等的翻译技巧。各章节后配有练习，包括句子和短文翻译作业材料，以便学生通过实践，熟悉翻译技巧，培养翻译能力。同时，为满足英语专业学生参加全国英语专业八级考试的需要，本书第4章关于翻译技巧的绝大多数短文练习采用了1995—2011年全国英语专业八级考试翻译部分历届试题。第5章采用了“韩素音青年翻译奖”竞赛试题。以上内容都是区别于全国同类翻译教程的特色所在，它不求高深，但求实用和适用，使学生通过较为系统的理论学习和实践，掌握翻译的基本知识和技巧。

本书提供的全国英语专业八级考试翻译部分历届试题(1995—2011年)和“韩素音青年翻译奖”竞赛试题参考答案完全是为了教学、教育目的而制作，参考答案分别源自洛阳师范学院英语系语言学教研室及邹申主编的《新编高等院校英语专业八级考试指南》(上海：上海外语教育出版社，2001，转引自松园英文书院 <http://www.hienglish.org/tem8/tem-8.htm>)和《中国翻译》及网址 <http://www.enmajor.com/cn/Html/TEM/TEM8/6157444652595.html> 等，方便教师教学和安排学生学习、比较。

本书的框架设计、具体章节编写和全书的修改、统稿和定稿工作由熊俊负责。第1章、第2章、第3章、第4章由熊俊编写，第5章、第6章由王林编写，熊俊、徐向晖共同参与第7章的编写工作。



本书所选题材来源均在参考文献中列出，在此谨向原作者和原编译者表示诚挚的谢意。本书于2011年7月首次印刷，全国知名学者、翻译专家，华中师范大学英语系主任、翻译研究中心主任，中国翻译协会理事，武汉译协副会长兼秘书长，国家社会科学基金项目同行评议专家华先发教授在百忙中审阅了全书，对本书的编写提出了宝贵意见，并为本书作序，在此再次表示由衷的感谢。之后本书又多次重印。此次再版得到了武汉大学出版社外语分社谢群英社长的大力支持，在此谨致谢忱。

由于编者水平有限，疏漏和缺憾在所难免，欢迎专家和读者们批评指正，以帮助我们进一步改进。

1.1 Definition of Translation

Being a very complicated human activity, translation can be roughly defined as a representation or recreation in one language of what is written or said in another language. Definitions of translation are almost as numerous and varied as the persons who have taken to discuss the subject. Here are some representative definitions at home and abroad:

The term translation itself has several meanings: it can refer to the general subject field, the product (the text that has been translated) or the process (the act of



producing the translation, otherwise known as translating).

—Jeremy Munday

Translating is the replacement of textual material in one language (SL) by equivalent textual material in another language (TL).

—J. C. Catford

Translating consists in reproducing in the receptor language the closest natural equivalent of the source-language message, first in terms of meaning and secondly in terms of style.

—Eugene A. Nida

Translation belongs not just to linguistics but more properly to semiotics, the science of sign systems or structures, sign processes, and sign functions, involving a whole set of extra-linguistic aspects.

—Susan Bassnett-McGuire

Translation is the replacement of textual material in one language (SL: source language) by equivalent textual material in another language (TL: target language).

—Huang Long

Translating is the art of recomposing a work in another language without losing its original flavor.

—Columbia Encyclopedia

Translation is a rendering from one language into another, i. e. the faithful representation in language of what is written or said in another language.

—Liu Zhongde

Translation is rendering the meaning of a text into another language in the way that the author intended the text.

—Peter Newmark

Translation is a process which occurs between cultures rather than simply between languages.

—Shuttleworth & Cowie

Communicative translation is generally oriented towards the needs of the target language reader or recipient. A translator who is translating communicatively will treat source text as a message rather than a mere string of linguistic units, and will be concerned to preserve source text's original function and to reproduce its effect on the new audience.

It is not the source text, or its effects on the source-text recipient, or the function



assigned to it by the author, that determines the translation process, but the prospective function or purpose of the target text as determined by the initiator's, i. e. client's, needs.

The above definitions have revealed the nature of translation in view of a certain aspect, such as: cross-linguistic, cross-cultural and cross-social communication; a science (it has its own inherent laws); an art (it is the recreation of the source text); a craft (it needs appropriate ways of expressing in the target language); a skill; an operation.

We can quote the *Cambridge Encyclopedia of Language* to sum up translation as a task to be accomplished:

It is sometimes said that there is no task more complex than translation—a claim that can be readily believed when all the variables involved are taken into account. Translators not only need to know their source language well;



they must also have a thorough understanding of the field of knowledge covered by the source text, and of any social, cultural, or emotional connotations that need to be specified in the target language if the intended effect is to be conveyed. The same special awareness needs to be present for the target language, so that points of special phrasing, local (e. g. regional) expectations, and so on, can all be taken into account.

1.2 Classification of Translation

Translation falls into the following categories:

I. In Terms of Languages

1. translation from native languages into foreign languages
2. translation from foreign languages into native languages

II. In Terms of the Mode

1. oral interpretation: instantaneous (consecutive), simultaneous, sight interpretation

2. written translation
3. machine translation

III. In Terms of Materials to Be Translated

1. translation of scientific materials
2. translation of literary works such as novels, stories, prose, poetry, drama, etc.
3. translation of political essays such as treatises on social problems, reports, speeches, etc.
4. translation of practical writings such as official documents, contracts and agreements, notices, receipts, etc.

IV. In Terms of Disposal

1. full-text translation
2. abridged translation
3. adapted translation
4. rewriting in another language

V. In Terms of Semiotics

1. intralingual translation: rewording; an interpretation of verbal signs by means of other signs of the same language
2. interlingual translation: translation proper; an interpretation of verbal signs by means of some other languages
