解题说明

专科起点升本科英语统考试题第一部分为：语音，这部分试题要求考生从所给的四个单词的划线部分选出一个与其他三个读音不同的单词。本部分主要测试考生对单词正确读音的掌握程度，内容涉及元音知识和辅音知识。

考生在做这部分试题时，要注意以下两点：① 掌握好单词的基本读音；② 熟练掌握一些不符合规律的单词读音。

例① A. starteded B. closeded C. waiteded D. neededed

答案 B。

规则动词的过去式在加-ed 后，在清辅音后（“t”除外），读[t]；在浊辅音及元音后（“d”除外），读[d]；在[t]和[d]后读[id]。

辅音组合[tion]在非重读音节中通常读作[jən]和[jn]，但当[tion]前面是s时，读[tʃən]或[tʃn]。
